- Meeting of I* leaders in October 2013
- A statement of common positions and priorities for Internet governance
- Four key points:
 - Global cohesion, threatened by national fragmentation and distrust created by surveillance practices
 - Support for continued multi-stakeholder processes to address Internet governance issues
 - Acceleration of efforts to globalise ICANN and the IANA functions
 - Global prioritisation of IPv6 adoption

A neutral, open forum to discuss Internet challenges

- Mailing list (discuss@1net.org)
- Online discussion forum (forum.1net.org)
- Steering committee (1net.org/steering-committee)
 - 21 members (from Bus, Tech, Academia, Civil Society)
- Launched following I* Montevideo meeting
 - Roughly concurrent with announcement of NETmundial meeting, but TWO separate things



- Organisers: CGI.br (multi-stakeholder BR org) and 1Net
 - With Argentina, Brazil, France, Germany, Indonesia, South Korea,
 Tunisia, Turkey, United States of America, [India?]
- A one-off event?
 - RIPE NCC remains focused on IGF as primary Internet governance venue - all NETmundial outputs should feed into IGF!
 - A potential opportunity for making further progress on Internet governance issues
- RIPE NCC = an interested observer, ready to contribute and participate where useful



NETmundial (2)

- Inputs/outcomes:
 - Principles for global Internet governance
 - Future roadmap for Internet governance development

- Issues for the RIPE NCC
 - Ensuring issues and concerns of our membership/ community are represented
 - Globalisation of IANA, ICANN
 - Ensuring multi-stakeholder engagement and decisionmaking in Internet governance
