- Increased ITU interest in Internet governance issues, particularly since around 2008
 - WTSA-08, Res.64, which led to the ITU IPv6 Group
- RIPE NCC staff have participated in events including:
 - WCIT-12
 - WTDC-12
 - WTPF-13
- Also participating in regional groups:
 - CEPT Com-ITU
 - RCC Group
 - Group of Arab States



2013

- World Telecommunication Policy Forum (WTPF)
 - Provided Opinions on the need for deployment of IPv6,
 IPv6 capacity building and fostering IXP growth
 - Supported multi-stakeholder Internet governance and operationalisation of Enhanced Cooperation
- Generally positive outcomes
 - Move to open up closed ITU forums, specifically
 CWG-Internet



WTDC 14

World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC 14)
 in Dubai in April

- Focus on development, most issues not within RIPE NCC remit
- However,
 - Implementation report of WTDC-10 showcases numerous IPv6 capacity building efforts, many in collaboration with RIRs
 - WTDC-10 output included Resolution 63, "IP address allocation and encouraging the deployment of IPv6 in the developing countries", and numerous IPv6-related capacity building initiatives
 - Resolution 63 is again up for discussion, linked to Resolutions from other Sectors (Res 64, WTSA-12)

 - Openness and transparency of ITU processes
