RIPE NCC GDC contribution...



- Digital inclusion and connectivity: We emphasised shared collaboration, shared responsibility, and inclusion of all stakeholders as core principles in connecting all people to the global Internet.
- Internet governance: We argued that the value of the Internet comes from being a unified global network of networks and urged all stakeholders to safeguard this open and interoperable global resource, as it is also a backbone for achieving the 17 SDGs. We highlighted the difficulties associated with the proliferation of Internet governance venues and discussions.
- Global digital commons: We argued that open-source software and services have an essential role in the functioning of the open, global Internet and are a fundamental element in the diverse range of systems and software that make the Internet viable.
