RIPE NCC

- A not-for-profit membership association
- Founded in 1992
- Serving as Regional Internet Registry for 76 countries
- almost 20.000 LIR accounts
- Around 150 staff based in Amsterdam, Dubai and Moscow





Réseaux IP Européens (RIPE)



- Since 1989 discussion forum open to all parties interested
- Not a legal entity and no formal membership
- Develops policies
- Work done in Working Groups
- Activities are performed on a voluntary basis
- Decisions formed by consensus
- RIPE Meetings twice a year

Who Does What?

- The RIPE community
 - Creates & discusses proposals
 - Seeks consensus
- Working Group (WG) Chairs
 - Accepts policy proposals
 - Chairs the discussions
 - Decides if consensus has been reached
- The RIPE NCC
 - Acts as the secretariat to support the process
 - Publishes policy documents and implements policies

When to Start a Policy Proposal?



 When something is missing, outdated or can be improved in the policies

- When not to do it?
 - Anything related to the RIPE NCC membership (fees, RIPE NCC activities)
 Solution: RIPE NCC General Meeting

Policy Development Process



• Open

- Anyone can participate
- On mailing lists and at meetings
- Transparent
 - List discussions archived publicly
 - Meetings transcribed
- Developed bottom-up
 - YOU make the policies
 - The RIPE NCC implements them



How a Working Group Chair makes a decision on consensus




- Consensus decisions are based on considering and addressing all concerns raised by a proposal
- One email is seen as one statement regardless how many people might be represented by this email





The RIPE Policy Development Process (PDP)



Impact Analysis



- RIPE NCC must create an impact analysis before a proposal can be published in Review Phase.
- How we understand the policy change, do we see issues, how we will implement it if it reaches consensus
- Main input point for the RIPE NCC, but we have no power on the decision of consensus, this will be taken by the WG chairs

"Regular abuse-c Validation" Policy



- approved on 1 June 2018
- gives the RIPE NCC a mandate to regularly validate "abuse-mailbox:" information and to follow up in cases where the attribute is deemed to be incorrect
- automated check of e-mails + manual check = accuracy

"Publication of Legal Address» proposal

 RIPE NCC to publish the validated <u>legal</u> <u>address</u> of the organisation which holds the Internet Number resource

needed to:

- combat malicious actors
- facilitate legal processes

 participate on mailing lists, proposal has just been published

LEA engagement



 LEAs and competent authorities are equal and important stakeholders and participants
