

The Internet Here Is Booming







Kazakhstan 157% growth in users

Uzbekistan 220% growth in users






Percentage of Individuals using the Internet

Our Data Shows the Same



- First meeting in 2014 105 attendees
 - Now you are with 271 registered!!
- Number of accounts in Kazakhstan grew to 67
 - We now serve 130+ accounts in this region
- Number of IPv4 allocations
 - KZ-290, KG-48, UZ-42, TM-5, TJ-21
- Number of networks (ASNs)
 - KZ-137, KG-48, UZ-51, TM-8, TJ-14

RIPE NCC is here




- In the last three years in this region

Growing Pains




- The pool of IPv4 is nearly exhausted
 - Only new members can apply for maximum of 1000 addresses
 - This might explain some of the growth
- Alternative is buying IPv4 on transfer market
 - 22,5 million addresses transferred in 2017 in our RIR
 - Number of transfers into KZ 98 (256 256 IPs), KG 3 (5120), TM -1 (8 192 IPs), TJ 0, UZ 0



There Is Not Much IPv6 Here



- IPv6 supposed to be the replacement for IPv4
 - Virtually unlimited number of addresses available
 - For now you can use both IPv4 and IPv6 at the same time
- Many providers in EU and US support IPv6
 - In this region almost no one does



Beyond IP distribution...



- Concerns about quality of registration data
 - Outdated contact details
 - Companies moving and merging
 - Can lead to problems further down the road
- Help to prevent IP address hijacks
 - Keep your data correct and secure
 - Guard your network against hijacks
- Improve stability and resilience of the Internet
