WSIS Process

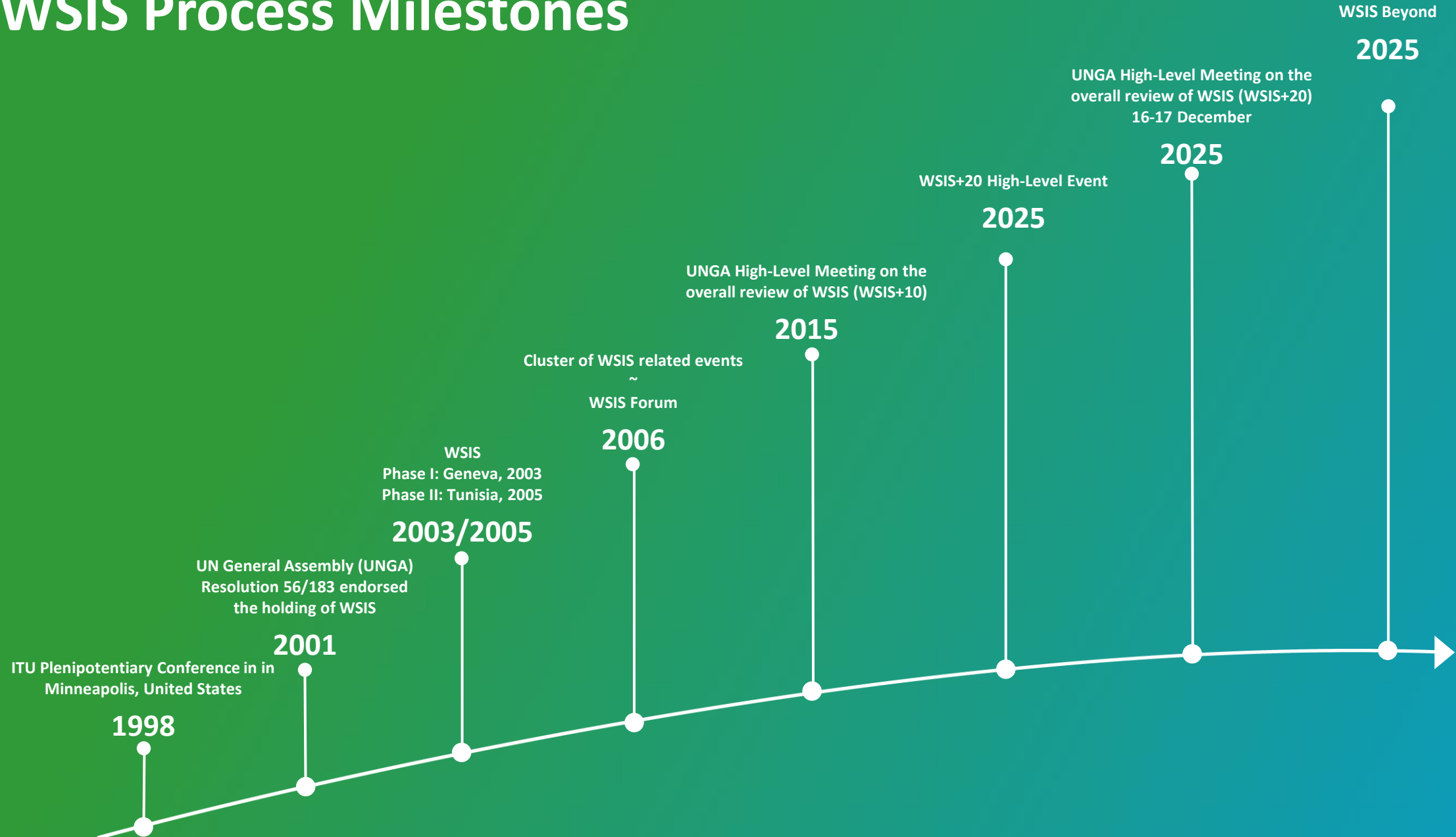
WSIS is a **UN process**, that involves more than 47 UN organisations and is built on the framework of the 11 WSIS Action Lines.

It encompasses **multistakeholder digital cooperation** within UN agencies including the governments, private sector, civil society, academia and the technical community.

The goal of WSIS is to achieve a common vision, desire and commitment to **build a people-centric, inclusive and development-oriented information and knowledge societies** where everyone can create, access, utilize and share information through digital and new technologies.
