



#### A bit of history

- Started in 2017
- ~ 9 fellows per RIPE Meeting
- 106 fellows from 38 countries
- In 2025 we started working on a redesign of the programme

# **Application Process**



- Take the 101 webinar and pass the Quiz (70%)
- Those who successfully pass will be invited to fill in the application form
- The Selection Committee will review all applications and notify selected candidates at least three months before the RIPE Meeting
- Those who are not selected will also be notified

# **Application Form**



- About you: Questions about you, link to Linkedin or CV
- Previous fellowship experience: Have you ever been a RIPE Fellow or granted a fellowship by another organisation (e.g. ICANN, IETF, ISOC, an RIR?)
- RIPE community: How familiar are you with the RIPE community?
- Learning goals: Level of interest and learning expectations
- **Financial assistance**: Financial-related questions
- **Other**: Whether you need a visa, etc.

## **Selection Process**



#### Applications are scored on:

- Alignment with RIPE's work
- Background and learning goals

#### We seek a balanced group based on:

- Learning track
- Region
- Gender



#### Internet Governance

- How Internet governance works globally and regionally
- The role of the multistakeholder model
- How core policy issues connect to the Internet's technical foundations

#### IP Address Management

- Registration of Internet number resources:
  IPv4 and IPv6 addresses, and ASNs
- The registry system: IANA, RIRs, LIRs
- RIPE policies
- The RIPE Database

#### **The Learning Tracks**



#### IPv6

- Promotion of IPv6 adoption
- IPv6 outreach, education, enablement
- Strategies to improve deployment and overcome operational challenges

#### Domain Name System (DNS)

- How DNS works and how it is relevant to network operations
- Recommendations and Best Current Practices for DNS operators
- DNS software implementations, with a focus on security and scalability aspects

#### **The Learning Tracks**



#### Measurements & Tools

- Use Internet measurement tools (RIS, RIPE Atlas, RIPEstat) to conduct data analysis and Internet monitoring
- Engagement strategies to support the growth and maintenance of measurement networks

#### Routing

- Interconnection issues affecting network operators
- Concerns relating to inter- and intra-AS routing
- New technologies and new applications of existing ones

#### Security

- Use of Resource Public Key Infrastructure (RPKI) to secure BGP
- IPv6 security
- Tackling abuse of Internet infrastructure and resources
- Improve resilience and stability of the internet infrastructure
- Cryptography




