Co-ordination Services





Software Engineering




- Smooth sailing operationally
 - average response time well below 1 second
 - load approximately doubled since last year
- No news is good news!
- Cleanup of unreferenced person objects
 35 % / 100 k objects gone
- 70 tickets / day to <u>ripe-dbm@ripe.net</u>
 - 20% done by hostmasters
- Server software 3.2.0 released
- Prototype RPSLng Server


Membership Services

 - Developing membership pack






Registration Services



- Collaborate with RIRs on membership issues





- Welcome to APNIC staff
- Early Registration Project
 - Progress continues
- AfriNIC
 - Montevideo workshop
 - 2 Hostmasters trained at RIPE NCC
 - Attended Johannesburg meeting in September
 - AfriNIC have selected 4 host countries (EG, GN, MU, ZA)
 - Working on transition plan

- RIR Statistics project
 - Consistent raw data available from all RIRs
 - Format updated

Number Resource Organisation

- Vehicle for even closer RIR co-ordination
- One point of entry into RIR system
- Protection of the "unallocated address pool"
- NRO established on 24 October 2003
- NRO Executive Council
 - CEOs of RIRs
- NRO Numbers Council
 - Providing advice to EC
- NRO Secretariat
- Intention: Offer NRO as body assuming the role of the Address Supporting Organisation of ICANN




Information Services

- ... are really "Co-ordination Services"
- Motivation: Protect open, bottom up industry selfregulation (aka the RIPE processes)
- Observations
 - Internet has become crucial infrastructure
 - Governments and regulators increasingly interested
 - Resource policy == public policy?
 - Myths and misinformation abound
- Provision of correct, targeted, easy to understand information by a neutral party.








- Test Traffic Measurements
 - Active measurements of the performance of your network:
 - Delay, packet loss, IP-level routing, jitter, ...
 - DNS monitoring
 - Bandwidth measurements to be added next
 - IPv4 and IPv6
 - Usage of the data
 - Debugging tool for your NOC
 - Trend analysis, plan upgrades
 - Monitor SLA's








DNSMON

- DNS is a critical part of the Internet Infrastructure
- gTLDs/ccTLDs servers have to be reachable at all times
- Lots of bad measurements out there:
 - One location only
 - Is the problem with the server or the user?
 - ICMP traffic
 - Can be blocked
 - Does not say anything about DNS
 - People (press, regulators) use them against you








- Routing Information Service (RIS)
 - Collects BGP data from participants and stores it in a database
 - Looking glass style information but
 - Historical information available
 - Not bound to any particular AS
 - IPv4 and IPv6
 - The RIS collects information at 10 IX's around the world
 - User can do all kinds of queries on the database
- Looking for site in Middle East







myASN

- Monitors how your AS is visible around the world:
 - Site enters its expected BGP configuration
 - myASN tool looks at actual configuration
 - Warning is sent when there is a difference
- New tool
 - Proof of concept
 - <u>http://www.ris.ripe.net/cgi-bin/myasn/index.cgi</u>
 - Need a separate account but...
 - ... will be integrated with the LIR portal in 2004



RIPE NCC Information Services

"You have all the data on IP address usage. You should make it public and become a trusted authority and consultant to governments and regulators."



Motivation

- ... to preserve the open, bottom up industry self-regulation
- Goal:
 - "To establish the RIPE NCC as a known and trusted source of high quality information about number resource distribution and related policy formation."
- Rationale:
 - Misinformation leads to FUD
 - FUD leads to flawed action endangering self-regulation
 - Educate and gain stability
- Partner up, don't try to do it alone



For Instance...

• WSIS

– World Summit on the Information Society

- "The coordination responsibility for root servers, domain names, and Internet Protocol (IP) address assignment should rest with a suitable international, inter-governmental organization."
- Need to correct wrong impressions
- Work with "enlightened" governments and others ISOC, CENTR, ICANN, ICC, ...



The Role of Membership Surveys

- Intention
 - Structured opportunity to voice opinion / suggestions
 - Anonymous
 - RIPE NCC: Better understanding of needs
- Surveyor
 - Neutral third party
- Style
 - No easy "tick yes or no"
 - Fostering considered responses
- Regularity
 - Every two to three years
 - Next: early 2005
