
CENTR

General Assembly - I

- Governing body of CENTR
- Comprised of representatives of the CENTR Members and meets 4 times a year
- Approves membership, determines the budget, discuss policy issues and elects the Executive Committee
- The GA normally reaches decisions by consensus, but more contentious matters can be resolved by voting



General Assembly - II

- 21st CENTR General Assembly 19-20 February 2004 Salzburg, Austria
- 22nd CENTR General Assembly 21-22 June 2004 Stockholm, Sweden
- 23rd CENTR General Assembly 23-24 September 2004 Yerevan, Armenia



Executive Committee

- The Excom is elected by the General Assembly to run the organisation in accordance with the wishes of the CENTR Members.
- It is also the board of the limited company that provides the legal structure for CENTR.
- The Excom is led by a Chairman and comprises a Treasurer responsible for finances, plus three members interested in legal, technical and commercial issues.



Legal & Regulatory WG

- Brings legal subjects to the attention of the GA
- CENTR's framework for a professional exchange of legal knowledge
- Provides members with permanent legal input and advice according to discussions at the GA
- Responds to legal information requests by members



Legal & Regulatory WG

- Legal implications of IDN implementation
- Domain Name Regulation matters
- Competition & Communications Regulations
- Legal analysis of the ICANN Bylaws
- Commenting on the GAC principles



Administrative Work Shop

- CENTR's forum for exchange of information on administrative work and new administrative projects
- Provides a framework for discussions between member's administrative staff on topical administrative issues
- Proposes projects of benefit that can be assisted by the CENTR administrative community
- Prepares detailed administrative reports to the GA
- Presents new and notable administrative work occuring of interest to members



Administrative Work Shop - I

- 36 people from 18 registries participated in the meeting.
- .dk gave an overview on the Danish registration procedures. The registry operates with a special "pin-system": immediately after registration, the registrant receives a special pin code to activate the domain name. If this is not done within three months, the domain name is deleted.
- se presented how the liberalisation of their registration rules had been done. To be able to handle all registrations after the liberalisation, NIC-SE installed a new automatic system with an online form for registrars to fill and then send to the registry. The many mistakes made by registrars during the first period in handling this, showed that many registrars had not been appropriately prepared.



Administrative Work Shop - II

- .at, .nl, and .it gave presentations on how their registries are communicating and educating their registrars. Except special email lists and telephone "hotlines", all registries have to hold special courses for their registrars to keep their knowledge updated.
- DENIC gave a presentation on how far the German registry had deployed ENUM, and Patrik Falström gave an introduction on ENUM-basics. He urged registries to educate governments and local telecommunication communities, as the ccTLD registries are the ones with DNS experience and have a key role to play in ENUM deployment.
- The group received an introduction to DNSSec. It was recommended registries come up to speed as DNSSEC probably will be finalised in late 2003-early 2004 and deployment is likely to start soon.



Technical Working Group

- Provides a forum for members to present new technical projects with the possibility of peer review and assistance
- CENTR's forum for open discussion between member's technical staff
- Presents new and notable technical work occurring of interest to members
- Determines projects of benefit that can be assisted by the CENTR technical community
- Provides members with high-level technical reference documents



Technical Working Group - I

IDN Codepoints for European Languages

- This document aims to define a selection of codepoints, useful for deploying European languages whilst still constraining permissible code-point selection to a minimal set to reduce problems.
- Each code point is documented with its known applicability, so development of a suitable policy can be made on a language-by-language basis.
- Code-points that are not explicitly permitted by the registry, under this approach, are usually disallowed.
- Language codes in this document utilise ISO 639.2



Technical Working Group - II

IDN Implementation Survey

- Most ISPs will deploy IDNs, with majority opting for local languages only
- There appears to be only a few countries aware of legal requirements to support specific languages
- Only one European country has plans to introduce a complete bundling mechanism in their registration policy.

Registry Progress on Deploying IDNs

This paper documents known policies, and progress, of members based on responses to the IDN Survey.

IDN Registry Implementation Guide

This guide is designed to provide a reference for some of the key choices registries must make when deciding to implement Internationalised Domain Names in their registries.
