# What is CENTR?

- Council of European National Top Level Domain Registries
- Forum for TLD managers
  - Primarily ccTLDs (but gTLDs )
  - Mainly European (but members from 5 continents)



# CENTR's history

- Established as a non-profit organisation in 1999
  - Originated out of a RIPE working group
- Steady growth of members (two new members at the last GA)
- Staff grown from one office to three – Oxford, Salzburg, Brussels



# CENTR's structure

- Executive Committee
  - 5 members, including the Chairman and the Treasurer
  - 2 years appointment
  - It runs the organisation in accordance with CENTR members wishes
- Secretariat
  - General Manager
  - Communication Officer
  - Technical Officer
  - Administrative Officer



# CENTR's office re-invention

- From September 1, 2004, CENTR offices will be relocated in Brussels
- Main targets of this change:
  - Closer contacts with the European institutions
  - Enlarging our role in the Internet industry
  - Improve the work efficiency



# CENTR's work flow <sup>1</sup>

- The work flow is decided together by the Excom and the Secretariat
- CENTR Members gather at least four times a year during the GA. The GA is the governing body of CENTR
- CENTR Secretariat organises administrative, legal and technical workshops on a regular basis as well as ad-hoc ws



# CENTR's work flow <sup>2</sup>

- In carrying on its activities, CENTR is assisted by a Legal & Regulatory working group
- This WG goes through all legal matters that can be of CENTR members interest both at a “domestic level”, (eg. Changes to CENTR AoA), and at an international level (eg. ICANN bylaws)

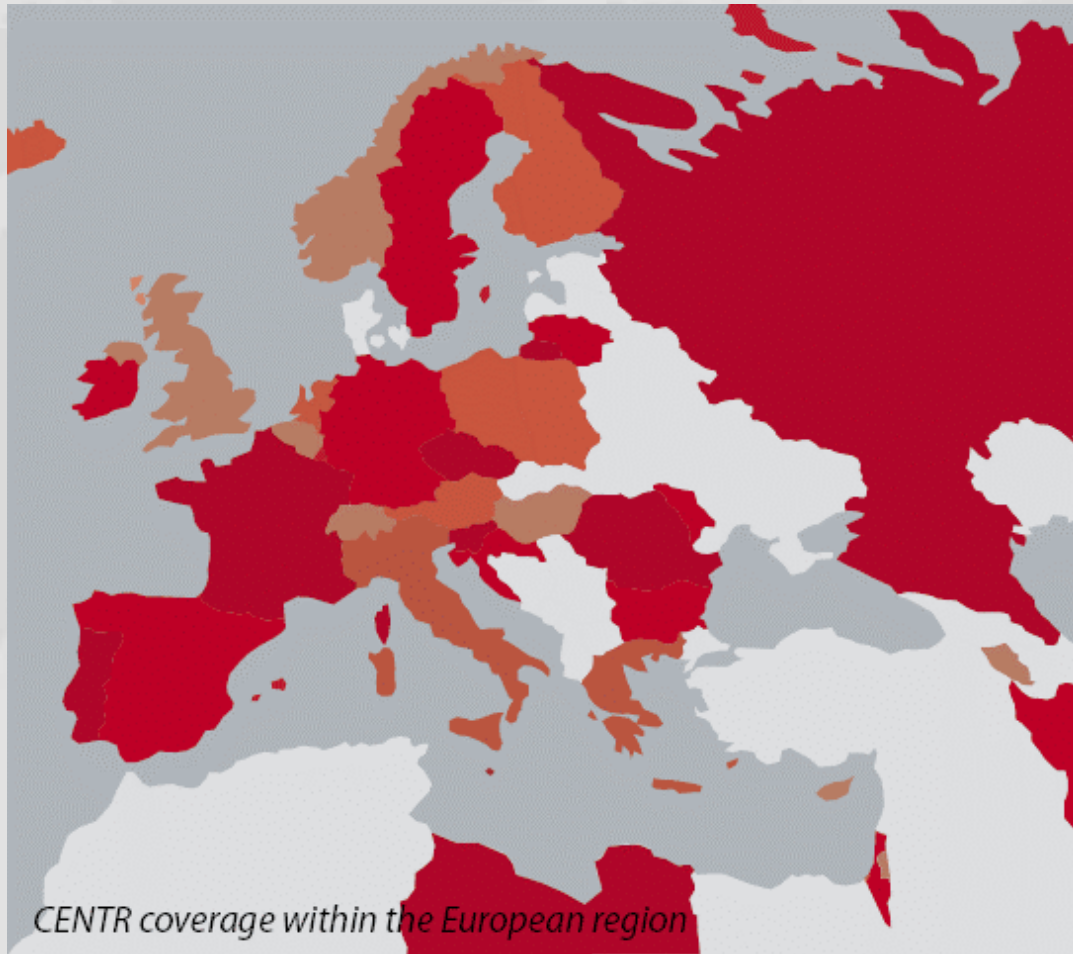


# CENTR's Membership

# CENTR's position

- A “regional” ccTLD organisation
  - 3 others: LACTLD, AFTLD, APTLD
- No strict geographic boundaries like RIRs
- Recognised as a key representative body for TLDs (by ICANN, ITU, European Union, national governments etc.)



# Benefits of diverse participation

- CENTR values participation from many different registries
  - Western and Eastern Europe, Americas, Asia, Oceania
  - Different regulatory regimes, Internet community expectations, use of domain names etc.
  - Different challenges is ensuring stable DNS/Internet
- Provides added value because
  - Brings different perspectives to discussion
  - Helps to define guidelines and best practices that benefit everyone
  - Comes to agreed opinions based on this dialogue within CENTR, so there is a unified opinion to the global arena



# Topical issues: ICANN/IANA<sup>1</sup>

- CENTR vision pursues the objective of co-operating to make the Internet root stable and reliable
- Each country's Internet community's right to administer their own ccTLD
- Ensuring the IANA (root) services are run simply and effectively



# Topical issues: ICANN/IANA<sup>2</sup>

- For these purposes, CENTR has:
  - Made a study on IANA on the basis of having monitored the IANA requests processing times from Sept 2003 till February 2004
  - Prepared a document on PGP verification of a request to IANA. PGP authentication can expedite times, making a genuine relationship manage at local level
  - Been keeping a mirror on IANA database (IANA shadowing)



# Topical issues: ICANN/IANA<sup>3</sup>

- CENTR created an Internet Infrastructure Support Funding Account
  - to intensify the communication between CENTR Members and ICANN on the management of the IANA
  - to help ICANN to implement a target orientated system for the IANA management
  - to assist CENTR Members to provide ICANN with financial stability on the IANA function to promote the accuracy of the IANA database
- Ten CENTR Members have joined this scheme



# Topical issues: ICANN/IANA<sup>4</sup>

- In the framework of the ccNSO – ccTLD discussion, CENTR
  - Fully support the ccNSO in the vision of being an on going process that will improve the relationship between ICANN and the ccTLDs community
  - Will be happy to play a liaison role in the ccNSO
  - Will work close to the ccTLDs Community to ensure that the ccNSO is an open forum where all the interested parties can intervene



# Topical issues: WSIS

- The UN General Assembly resolution A/RES/56/183 encouraged other intergovernmental organizations, including international and regional institutions, non-governmental organizations, civil society and the private sector to contribute to, and actively participate in, the intergovernmental preparatory process of the Summit and the Summit itself
- Within this context, CENTR:
  - Is an accredited member of the process
  - Monitors the progress of the actions laid out in the Geneva plan
  - Participate in the main session and stimulate the dialogue among its members



# Topical issues: IDNs

- So far CENTR has:
  - Organised workshops on this matter
  - Gathered information among its members
  - Been working on an IDN resource web site to be launched soon

# Topical issues: membership mark

- Special logo to be linked to a special page on CENTR website
- The page will contain CENTR basic information as well as registry key elements in standard format
- Logos are different according to the membership status



# Topical issues: outreach programme

- Launched in February 2004
- Aimed to support a stable and well functioning Internet in developing regions of the world
- Based on volunteer donations and on the expertise availability of CENTR Members
- The programme does not provide money in cash, but equipment, training and hosting of secondary servers
