Responses to War in Ukraine (1)



- RIPE NCC Executive Board Resolution on Provision of Critical Services
 - “...the means to communicate should not be affected by domestic political disputes, international conflicts or war.”

- Response to request from Ukrainian Government to deregister Russian IP addresses
 - “[...] unlikely to have immediate impact on interconnection or traffic in Russia, but it could have unpredictable consequences in terms of harming the global coordination that is necessary for stable Internet operations.”

Responses to War in Ukraine (2)



- Informed Ukrainian and Russian members that they do not risk closure if they cannot pay their invoices on time
- An Open Internet Remains the Goal
 - “The RIPE NCC has spent the past 30 years working to support a stable Internet [...] we cannot take or support any measures that risk undermining the Internet’s technical foundations”

- TL;DR: Internet has remained fairly stable in both countries so far

Investigating our Corporate Structure



- National or regional legislation in our service region increasingly has the potential to affect our operations
- Mitigation of the risk of disproportionate orders by law enforcement authorities from a single jurisdiction
- Have been investigating changes to our corporate structure to mitigate these risks
- Recent changes in geopolitics and legislation have been fast and unpredictable
- Will engage with the RIPE community when we have made progress with this work

Registry



- Number of transfer tickets has declined when compared to last year
- Number of new LIR applications has declined after a peak around November last year
- Workload remains high due to sanctions compliance
- Number of LIRs on IPv4 Waiting List currently at 827

Sanctions Compliance



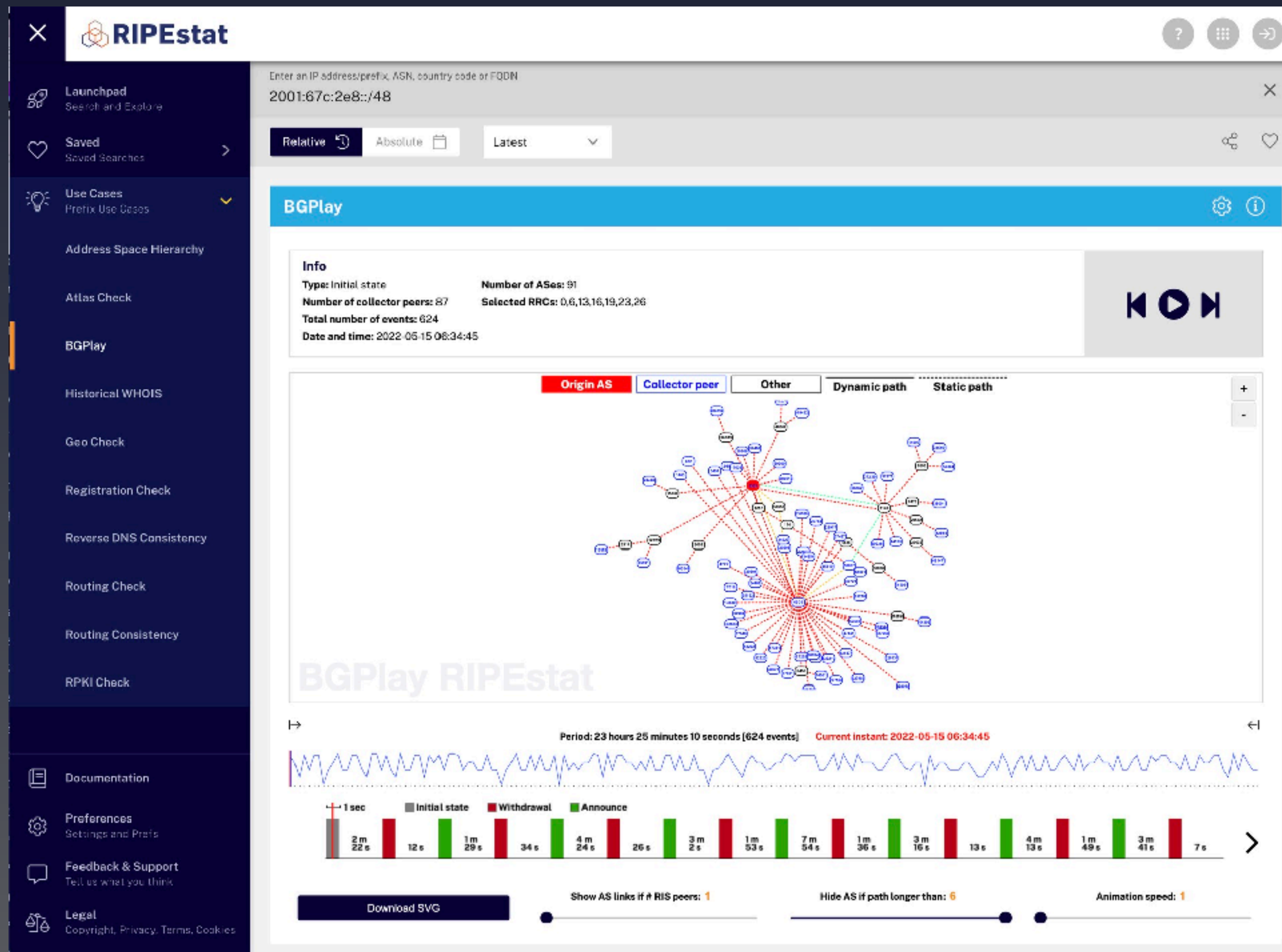
- Represents a significant increase in our workload
- Fresh sanctions against Russia are being issued regularly
- All potential cases treated as if they are sanctioned until our staff have conducted an investigation

2022 Invoicing



- Difficulties with our bank when invoicing members in Syria and Iran
- We have withheld invoicing members in these countries until we are certain their payments can be accepted
- We have also told Ukrainian and Russian members that they will not be closed if they cannot pay their invoices on time
- Though we might delay invoicing or grant extensions, all members have the same payment obligations and must eventually pay the full amount

BGPlay Update

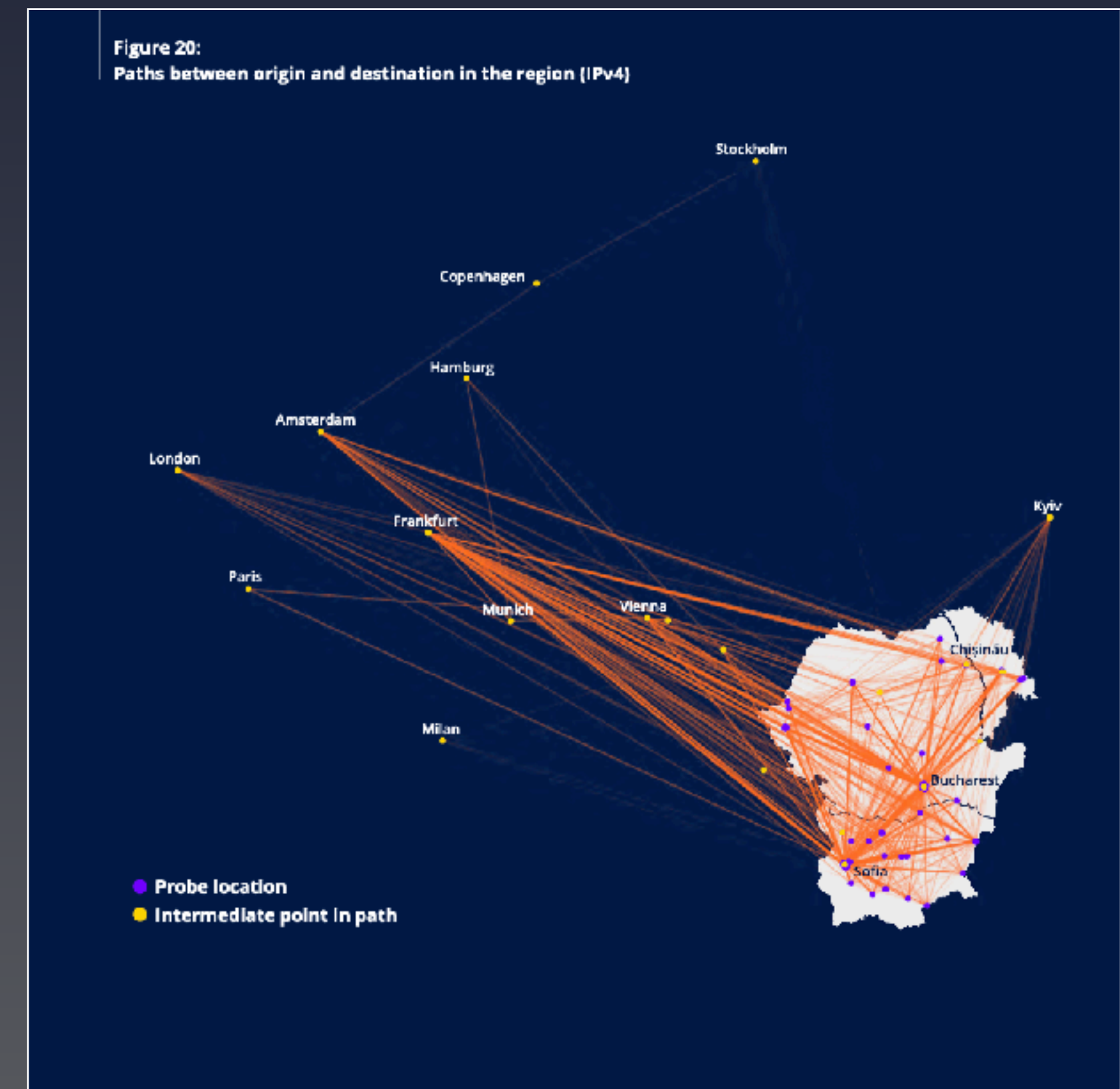


- Now integrated within the new RIPEstat UI

Internet Country Report: Bulgaria, Moldova and Romania

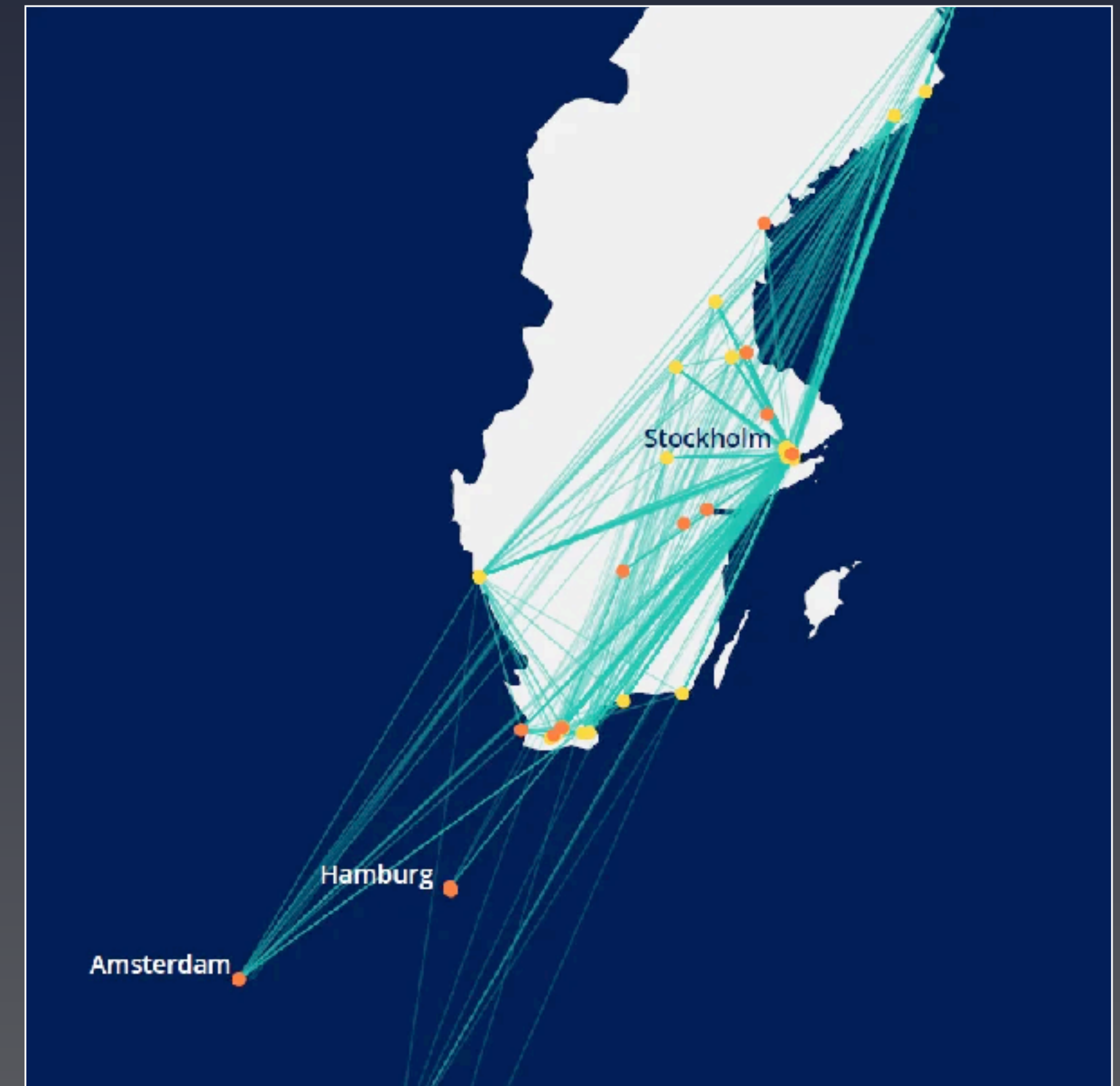
- Key findings:
 - All three countries have healthy market competition and high-speed, low-cost Internet access
 - Romania is the biggest exporter of IPv4 addresses in our service region
 - Despite their large amount of IPv6, Bulgaria and Moldova have low IPv6 capability rates
 - Good amount of interconnection and diverse array of upstream providers in all three countries

Internet Country Report: IPv6 in Sweden



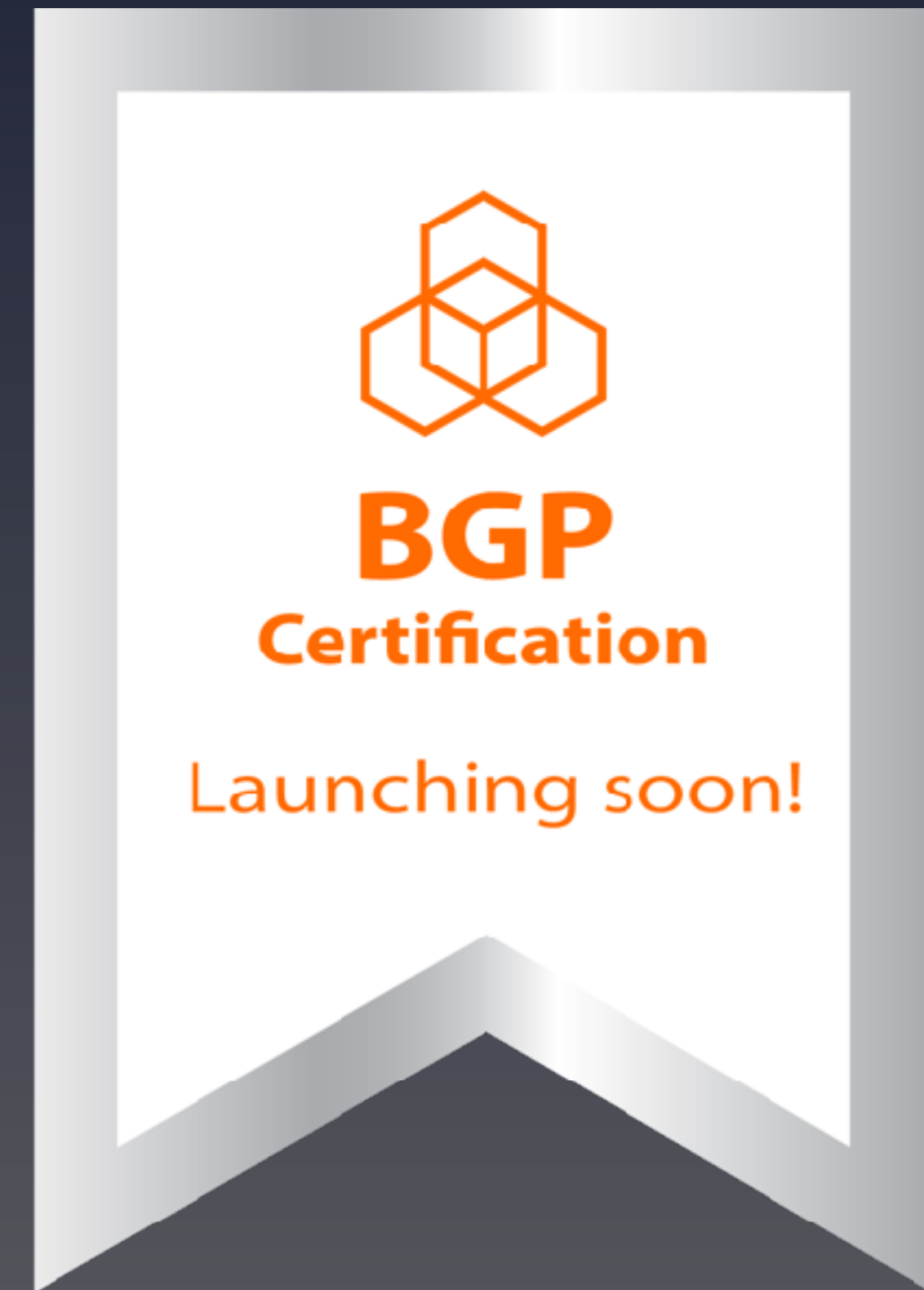
- Key findings:
 - Sweden has an unusually large amount of IPv4 for its population, which likely contributes to its low IPv6 deployment rate
 - The country's top Internet service providers vary greatly in terms of IPv6 capability, yet even the top IPv6 provider lags behind the world average
 - There is a good level of interconnectivity between Sweden's networks, over both IPv4 and IPv6, resulting in healthy redundancy
 - Domestic traffic paths tend to stay local over IPv6, and slightly less so over IPv4

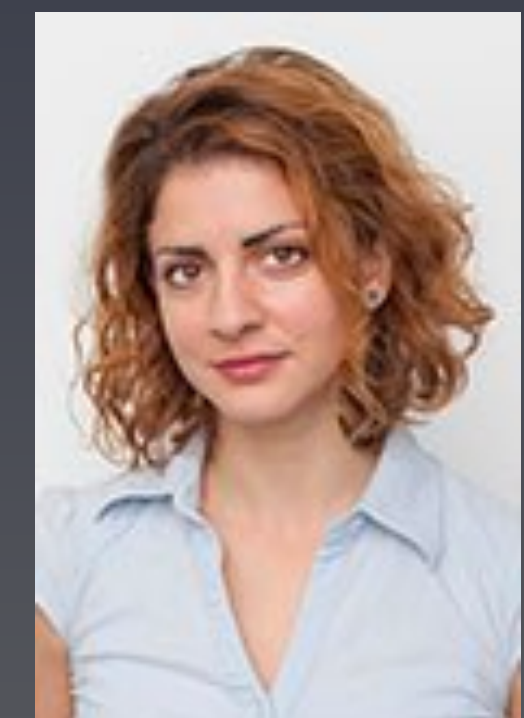

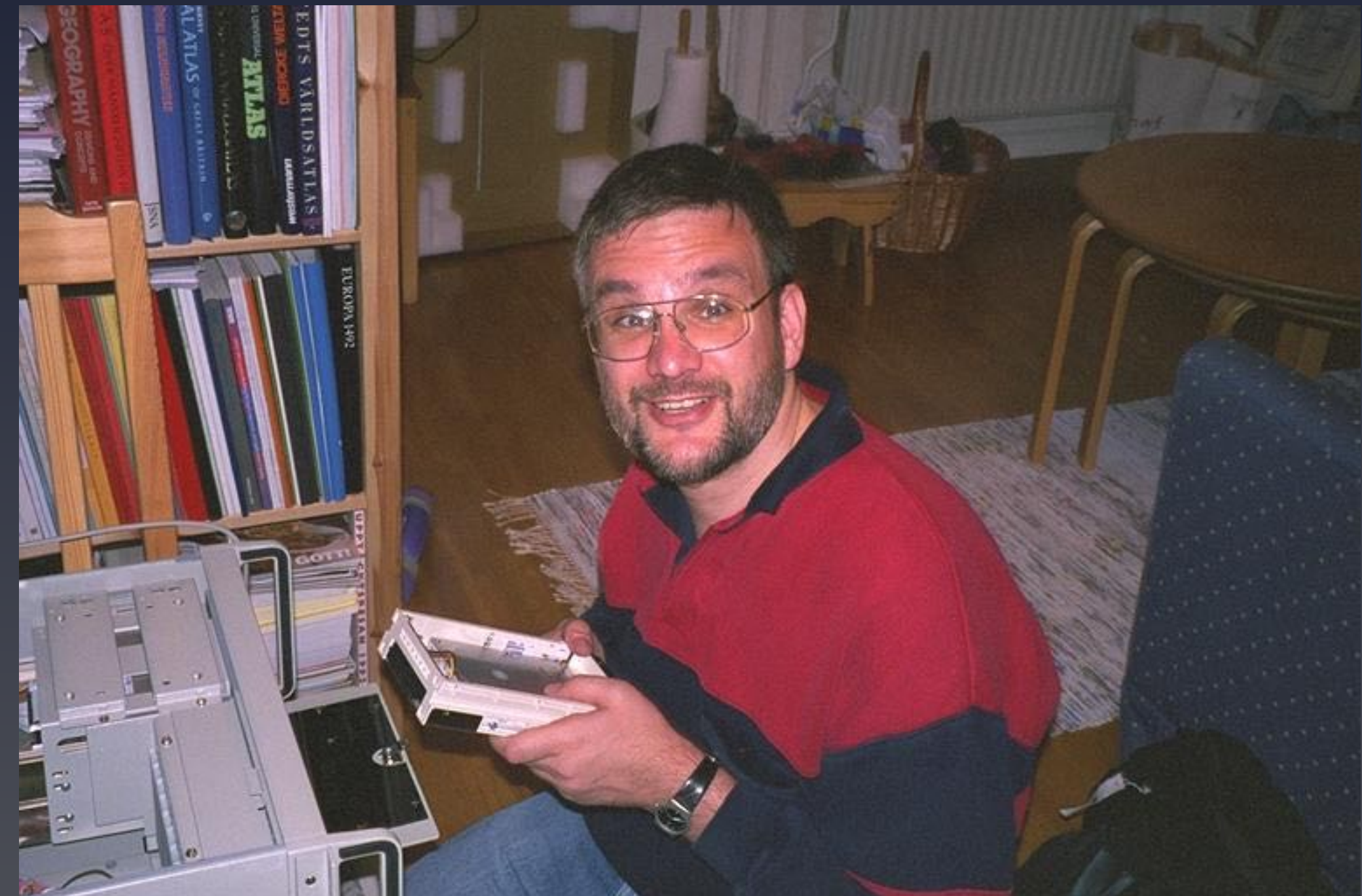
