

RIPE NCC Articles of Association

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Overview



- Proposed amendment
- Takes into account members who are voting remotely
- New procedure makes it easier for remote voters to challenge the result of the voting

Current procedure



- 1. The Chair announces the verdict of the results of a vote. This verdict is final and binding **unless it is immediately challenged**.
- 2. A new vote will be taken if so desired by "the absolute majority at the Meeting or, if the original vote was not taken per capita or by ballot, by someone present who was entitle to vote."
- 3. If there is a new vote, the original vote is void.

Proposed procedure



- 1. The Chair appoints a secretary to keep the minutes of the GM, recording the whole process, including the result of the voting and the resolutions adopted in the GM.
- 2. Within two working days after the GM, the draft minutes of the meeting will be officially adopted by the Chair and the secretary, and they will be published on the RIPE NCC website.

Proposed procedure (2)



3. The draft minutes of the meeting will be final and binding, unless the Executive Board receives a notice of objection signed by at least 100 members within three weeks of the publication of the draft minutes.

Proposed procedure (3)



- 4. Within three weeks of receipt of notice of objection, the Executive Board will consider the objections against the draft minutes and adopt the final minutes of the meeting, which shall be binding.
- 5. The final minutes will be published on the website within two working days of them becoming final and binding.
