When is an Arbiter "Unresponsive"?

When is an Arbiter "Unresponsive"?



"If an arbiter [...] is unresponsive for a period of one year, [...] the Executive Board will propose their dismissal."

Proposed

- During an arbitration case, they don't reply to clerical questions about:
 - the status of the case
 - important dates
 - other procedural matters
- For a period of one year, they do not reply to questions related to their function made by the RIPE NCC or other arbiters

RIPE NCC's SLA for Requests



- Submission of Request for Arbitration Form
- If not filled in with all requested information
 - The requester has two (2) months from the date of the submission to provide the missing information

RIPE NCC's SLA for Requests



- Submission of Request for Arbitration Form
- If not filled in with all requested information
 - The requester has two (2) months from the date of the submission to provide the missing information

RIPE NCC's SLA for Requests



- Submission of Request for Arbitration Form
- If not filled in with all requested information
 Proposed
 - The RIPE NCC will request the missing information within five (5) working days from the date of the submission of the Request for Arbitration Form
 - The requester has two (2) months from the date of the submission to provide the missing information

Conflict of Interest



 Arbiters with a conflict of interest must be excluded from the procedure

 If the conflict of interest becomes apparent during the arbitration, parties will be informed of the conflict of interest

Conflict of Interest





- Arbiters with a conflict of interest must be excluded from the procedure
 - E.g., if the Arbiter represents one of the parties
- If the conflict of interest becomes apparent during the arbitration, parties will be informed of:
 - The conflict of interest
 - Their option to request another arbiter

Conflict of Interest

- Arbiters with a conflict of interest must be excluded from the procedure
 - E.g., if the Arbiter represents one of the parties
- If the conflict of interest becomes apparent during the arbitration, parties will be informed of:
 - The conflict of interest
 - Their option to request another arbiter
- If the arbiter wants to ask the other arbiters' opinion on a case,
 - The arbiter with the conflict of interest will be excluded from the communication
