Voting at the GM

- Two ways to vote at the GM:
 - Paper ballot (attendees only)
 - Electronically (remote participants and attendees)
 - All members were informed of their voting rights
- Voting starts at Agenda point 10 for both methods
- Paper ballots must be handed in before you leave room today
- Electronic votes can be cast until 09:00 UTC+2 on Friday, 15 May




- Four resolutions to be voted on
- All resolutions need more than 50% of YES votes to be approved
- Abstentions are noted but do not affect the count

Electronic voting works in the exact same way



- All registered voters receive an email with a link to the voting pages
- You select one box and click Submit



- Four candidates for the Executive Board election
- Voting works differently than the resolutions
- We use instant run-off voting
- This means several rounds of voting can take place using just one ballot
- You need to rank the candidates in order of preference from 1 (most preferred) to 4 (least preferred)





You only need to number 1 candidate to have a valid vote

But to ensure your vote counts in every round, you should fill out all boxes from 1 to 4

With two seats available, lower preferences are important



- Electronic voting works in the same way
- Click a box to pick a number rather than type it





Counting the Votes

- We use the third party BigPulse system for voting
- After the voting deadline passes, paper votes are added to the electronic votes in the BigPulse system
- Independent observers from the other RIRs oversee the input of paper ballots into the system
- The paper ballots are stored in the hotel safe until 09:00 on Friday



Counting the Votes - First Seat

- If a candidate gets more than 50% of first preference votes, he is elected to the board
- If no candidate gets more than 50%, the candidate with the fewest first preference votes is eliminated from the count and his second preference votes are redistributed among the other three candidates
- This process continues until someone receives more than 50% of the votes



Counting the Votes - Second Seat

- The winner of the first seat is eliminated from the count for the second seat
- If your first preference vote was for the winner of the first seat, your second preference vote now counts as your first preference
- The process works the same as for the first seat:
 - A candidate needs more than 50% of votes to be elected
 - Candidates with fewest votes are eliminated and their votes redistributed until that happens




