Proposed Implementation Plan for the RIPE Policy "RIPE NCC Services to Legacy Internet Resource Holders"

Introduction

At the RIPE NCC General Meeting from 14-15 May 2014, the RIPE NCC membership will be presented with a resolution that asks members to vote on the RIPE NCC's proposed plan for implementation of the RIPE Policy <u>"RIPE NCC Services to Legacy Internet Resource Holders"</u>. This policy establishes the principles to be applied by the RIPE community in offering and implementing registry services for legacy Internet resource holders.

For some options to provide services for legacy Internet resource holders, the RIPE NCC would need to create and revise a number of contractual and procedural documents. By presenting a resolution on the implementation plan, the RIPE NCC Executive Board is asking the membership to approve this plan before the RIPE NCC creates and updates its contractual and procedural documents. Given the decision at the General Meeting in September 2012 by the membership to abolish paid services for non-members, the Executive Board believes it is important to have the approval of the membership before the RIPE NCC provides paid services to non-members in accordance with this policy.

Members will be asked to vote on a separate resolution to amend the RIPE NCC Arbitration Procedure, as required by the Articles of Association.

The table below outlines the contractual documents that the RIPE NCC plans to make available in order to comply with the policy.

The aforementioned documents require either the creation of new RIPE NCC procedural documents or the amendment of existing documents, including but not limited to those listed in the table below. The creation or amendment of further documents will be in line with the <u>Adoption Process for RIPE NCC</u> <u>Corporate Documents</u>.

Fees for Legacy Internet Resource Holders

Upon implementation, Legacy Internet Resource Holders that become a member will be charged in the same manner as other RIPE NCC members. However, the sign-up fee will be waived. Legacy Internet Resources that are registered through a sponsoring LIR will be charged a EUR 50 fee per resource. This excludes AS numbers. Legacy Internet Resource Holders that sign an agreement with the RIPE NCC according to option 4 of the policy are charged in the same manner as RIPE NCC members (annual fee + sign-up fee).

These fees will apply up to the moment a new charging scheme comes into effect.

Voting on the Resolution

The RIPE NCC General Meeting takes place on 14 May 2014. Resolution 3 asks members to vote on the following resolution:

"The General Meeting approves the proposed plan for implementation of the RIPE Policy 'RIPE NCC Services to Legacy Internet Resource Holders' as presented and documented by the RIPE NCC."

All RIPE NCC members are invited to vote on this resolution at the General Meeting. Voting is available for those in attendance and for those participating remotely via electronic voting.

The Executive Board encourages all members to register to vote at the General Meeting.
