





### Registration Overview







- 19,592 eligible voters
- 1,679 votesregistered
  - The voter turnout is 6.7%
- 75 countries



#### Voting on Resolutions



- There are three Resolutions to be voted on
- Resolution 1 requires more than 50% YES votes to pass
- Resolution 2 requires more than 50% YES votes to pass
- Resolution 3 requires more than 50% YES votes to pass

Note: Abstentions are noted, but do not count!

#### **Executive Board Election**



- Three candidates to fill two seats
- Instant run-off voting is used in the election
- Ranking candidates:
  - You must fill at least one preference for a ballot to be considered valid (or choose to abstain)
  - You must number your candidates in order of preference with 1 being your top preference
  - You can choose to fill as many preferences as there are candidates

#### Instant Run-off Voting




- Instant Run-off Voting is a preferential voting system where candidates must receive more than 50% of top preference votes to be elected
- If no candidate receives more than 50% in a round of voting, the candidate with the fewest top preference votes is eliminated
- The system then recalculates after redistributing votes according to the order of preference
- This process of elimination and recalculation continues until a candidate receives more than 50% of top preference votes
- For the second seat, the ballots are re-used and the process remains the same (discounting the votes for the winner of the first seat)



#### Paper Ballots


- Attendees only

#### Paper Ballots - Resolutions






- Make a mark in one box only for each resolution otherwise your vote will be deemed invalid

- Only use numbers from 1 to 3 or mark the Abstain box
- 1 is your most preferred candidate and 3 is your least preferred candidate
- Both seats will be filled on the basis of this list
