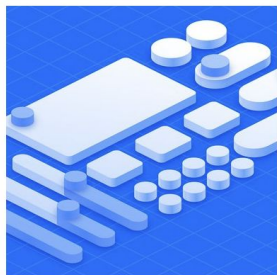

- Input on the updated draft from all the RIR and ICANN communities is being gathered from April-May 2025

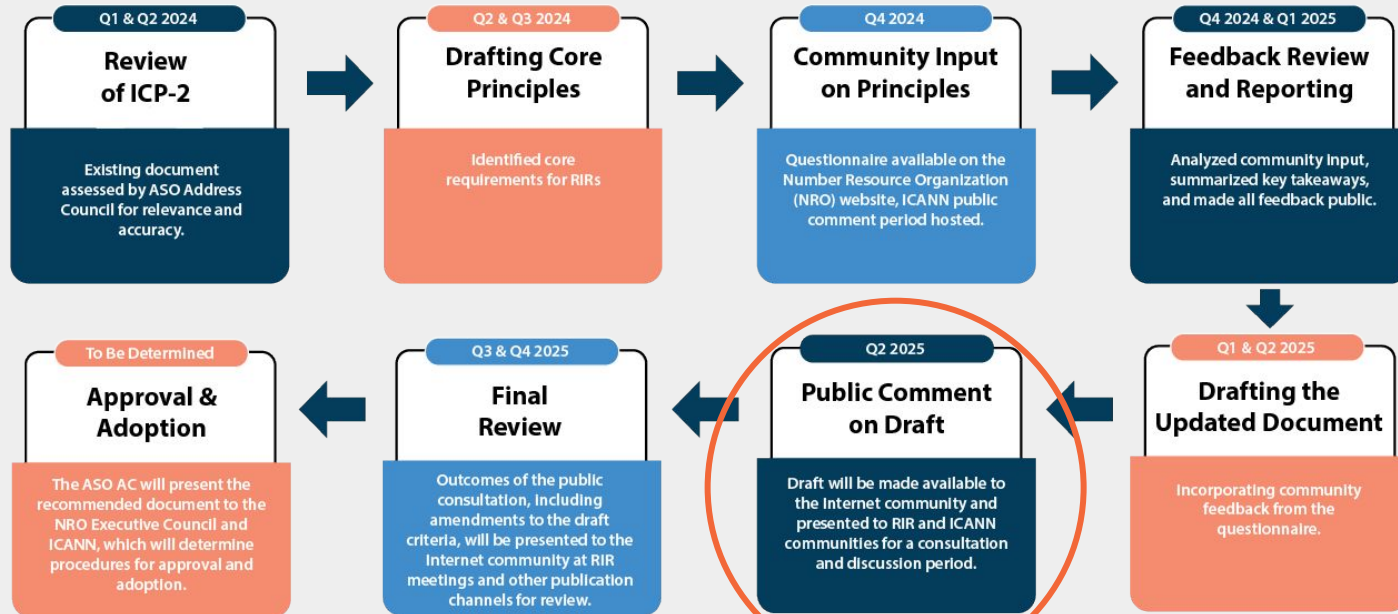

The ICP-2 Review Process Explained

In 2023, the ASO Address Council began reviewing Internet Coordination Policy 2 (ICP-2), which was developed in 2001 to set criteria for the establishment of new Regional Internet Registries. The review is needed to ensure the criteria remains relevant, accurate, and aligned with today's Internet landscape. Review of ICP-2 is an open and transparent consultation process, allowing participation from across the global Internet community.

WELCOME TO THE 2024 RIPE NCC ANNUAL REPORT

In 2024, we focused on ensuring cost efficiency while delivering the same quality service to our

members. We explored new sources of revenue, strengthened our financial position, and allowed us to invest in our infrastructure. In March, while we were still in the process of raising 38.2M EUR

Draft RIPE NCC Charging Scheme 2026

Introduction

The Charging Scheme model is based on the principle that members pay an annual contribution (service fee) per Local Internet Registry (LIR) account. Members also pay additional fees for independent and Legacy Internet Resources as defined in this document. New memberships or additional LIR accounts for existing members cost an additional one-time sign-up fee alongside the annual contribution.

The RIPE NCC is a not-for-profit organisation. Nevertheless, a positive or negative financial result can be achieved in a particular year. Each year the membership decides at the General Meeting on how to allocate the surplus or deficit. The surplus or deficit can either accumulate in a special reserve or it can be redistributed to the members.

RIPE NCC Charging Scheme 2026

For 2026, the RIPE NCC will submit the Charging Scheme 2025 without any changes. The reason for this is that the current Charging Scheme is expected to be sufficient to cover operating expenses in 2026. The Charging Scheme Task Force will continue to do their work to ensure that we come to a revised Charging Scheme in the near future.

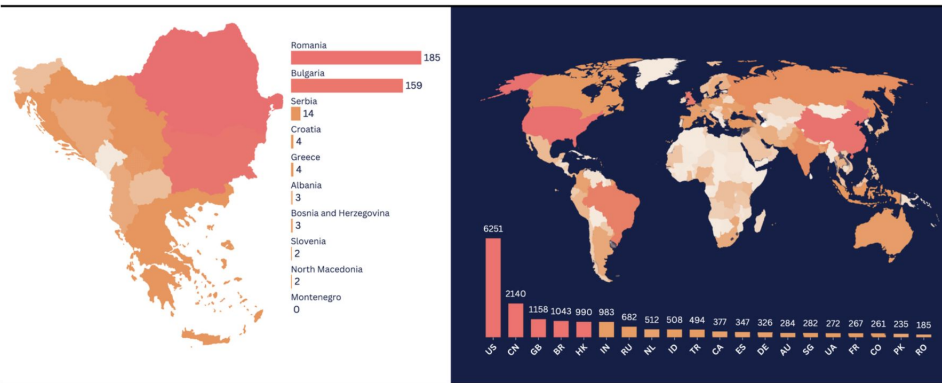

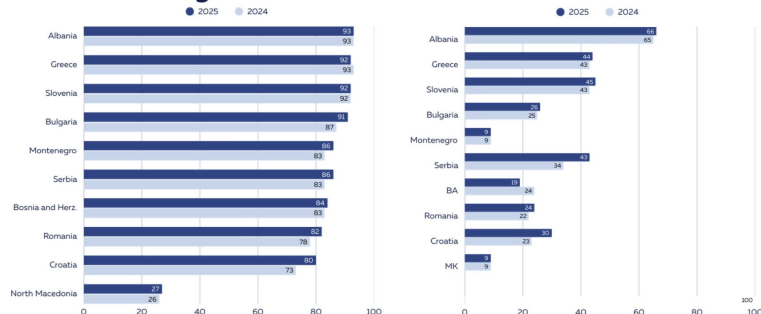
BGP incidents in the SEE region and globally

IPv6 ROA Coverage in SEE Region

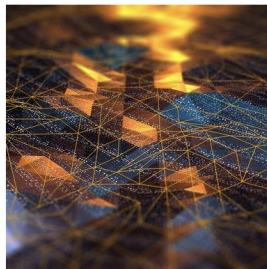

Country Codes in the SEE Region



- The RIPE Database follows the officially assigned ISO-3166 country codes:
 - Country codes in the RIPE Database do not represent a RIPE NCC position on which country a particular territory belongs to
 - The RIPE NCC does not issue resources to countries
 - The resources are delegated to resource holders based on direct or indirect contractual agreements with the RIPE NCC
- A community effort towards officially adding a new country code to the ISO-3166 framework could be the best way forward

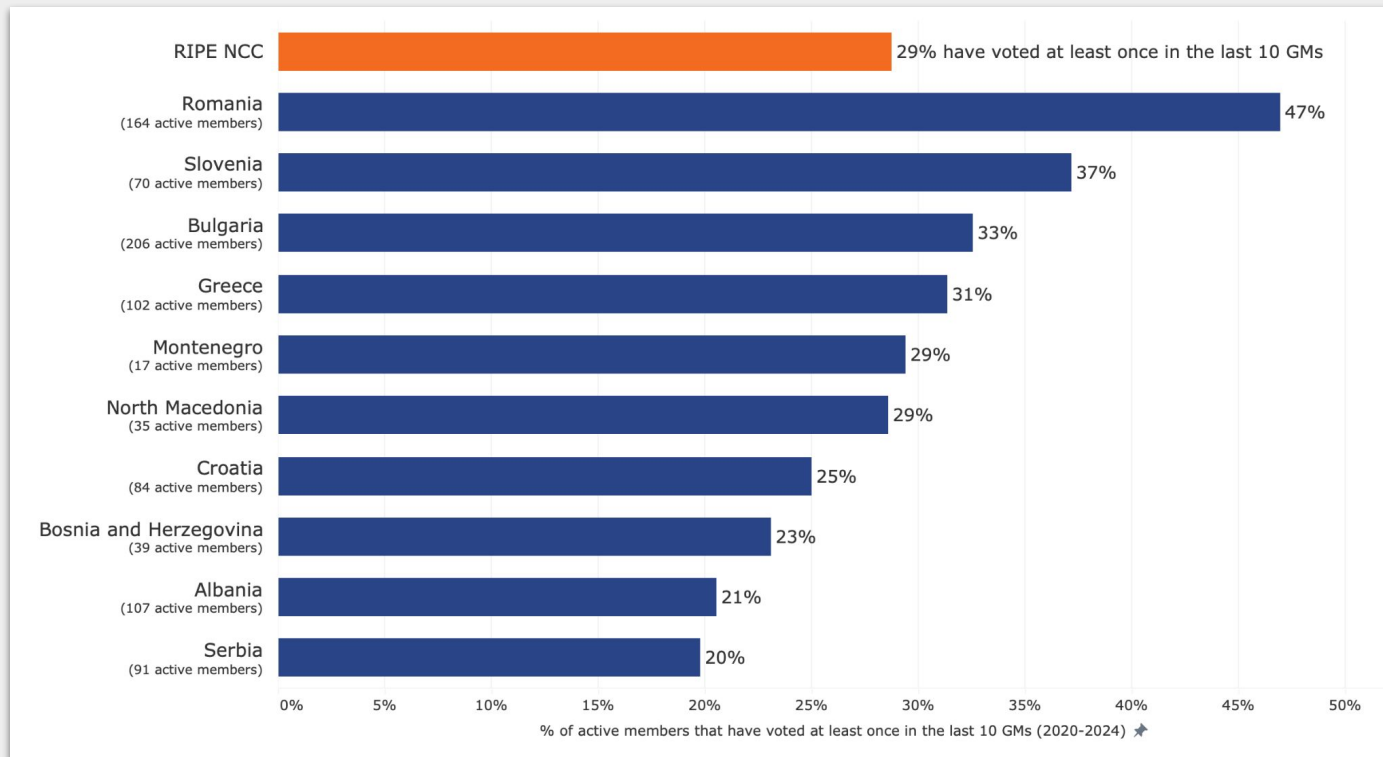
