- Piotr Strzyżewski from the Executive Board is here at SEE 8



RIPE NCC Membership Overview






- Unprecedented growth in 2018
- Membership projected to reach 24,000 LIRs by end 2019


SEE Region LIR growth






ASNs in SEE






IPv4 Addresses in the SEE Region





IPv6/32s in the SEE Region






IPv6 RIPEness



- Awarding stars based on IPv6 preparedness
- 1 star: Having an IPv6 allocation or assignment from the RIPE NCC
- 2 stars: Visibility in the Routing Information Service (RIS)
- 3 stars: Having a ROUTE6 object in the RIPE Database
- 4 stars: Having a reverse DNS delegation set up
- There is now a fifth star for deploying IPv6 at the edge

Recent Activities

Our Strategic Focus for 2019



- Preparing for strong membership growth and anticipated fall-off after our IPv4 pool is finished
- Ensuring accuracy of the RIPE Registry
- Focus on due diligence and fraud prevention
- Adding value through our training services
- Providing neutral information, tools and measurements to support the RIPE community
- Strengthening the K-root server infrastructure

Due Diligence Procedures



- Strengthening of due diligence procedures
- There was a 106% increase in hijack investigations in 2018 compared to 2017
- More cases of fraud as IPv4 resources increase in value
- There is a thorough review procedure for LIR investigations
- Closures are taken very seriously, and after issuing warnings

Keep your contact details up to date!

Hijackers often target resources with outdated contacts!

Simplifying our Billing Processes



- Annual-only billing process from 2019
- A strong need to focus on efficiency as our membership continues to grow
- Support offered to help members with financial constraints make the transition
- Membership fee is much less than when quarterly payment options were first introduced (especially considering return of budget surplus to membership)

Policy Implementation: Abuse-C Validation



- Implementation started in February 2019
- Initial check of over 70,000 contacts
- Automated validation emails sent to abuse contacts that fail this check
- Manual follow-up by our staff if these abuse contacts are not updated
- LIR ORGANISATION and resource objects finished now checking End User abuse contacts
- Please look out for any emails from us about this!

E-Learning



- Expanding our e-learning activities
- Webinars and a new online academic partnership model with the American University of Beirut (AUB)
- RIPE NCC Certified Professionals: Online certification programme through proctored exams
- Launching in late 2019 early 2020





Get an overview of our activities in 2018

RIPE Community Developments



- RIPE Community Report 2018
 - https://labs.ripe.net/Members/hans_petter_holen/ripe-community-report-2018
- RIPE Chair Replacement Procedure (v.05)
 - A Selection Committee of RIPE community volunteers selects new chairs
 - A new Vice Chair role is established
 - Introduces five-year terms with a two-term limit
 - Community aims to to reach consensus at RIPE 78
 - Discussion on ripe-chair-discuss@ripe.net

Current Policy Proposals



- 2018-06: Aims to delete non-authoritative objects in the RIPE IRR if they conflict with an RPKI ROA
- 2019-01: Clarification of the definition of "Assigned PA"
- 2019-02: Aims to reduce the IPv4 allocation size to a /24 once the RIPE NCC is unable to allocate contiguous /22 ranges
- 2019-03: Defines BGP Hijacking as a violation of RIPE policy

RIPE NCC Survey: Tell us what you think!




- Our last survey gathered input from 4,400 people


Have your say

- Watch the GM via webstream, vote electronically


GM Participation from the SEE Region
