Regional Internet Registries (RIR)



- There are five RIRs in the world:
 - AFRINIC, APNIC, ARIN, LACNIC and RIPE NCC
- Not-for-profit membership organisations
- Distribute and register Internet Number Resources: IPv4, IPv6 and ASNs
 - "Created" by the IETF.
 - Each RIR has its own service region
 - Policy decided per region to accommodate differences

The RIPE Database



- Public Internet resource and routing registry database
 - IP addresses, AS Numbers
 - Contact information
 - Reverse DNS delegations
 - Routing policies

Quality of the Registration Data



- **RIPE NCC does controls**
 - Before the registration
 - After the registration
- Through contractual relationships
 - Between the RIPE NCC and the LIRs
- Verifying compliance with RIPE policies
- Performing audits, Assisted Registry Check (ARCs)
- Changes must be supported with documentation

Non-Public Data



- Only provided if a Dutch court order or other legally binding order is presented by a Dutch LEA
- LEAs and other organisations operating outside of the Netherlands are required to follow the mutual legal assistance treaties (MLAT) procedures
- The RIPE NCC will evaluate each order
- If an order is considered illegal or of a non-obligatory nature, the RIPE NCC will not comply and challenge it

Incorrect information in the RIPE Database

- Invalid/false data in organisation object
- Invalid/false data in person objects

• Causes:

- Old objects
- Lack of maintenance
- Bad intentions

Investigating reports



- Benefit of doubt
 - People just forget to update the database
- RIPE NCC contacts the member
- We might take further action:
 - Start an audit
 - Closure
- Outcome never reported back to reporter

Closing an LIR



- Contractual
 - Bankruptcy
 - Non payment
- Legal
 - Non compliance with Dutch law
- Fraudulent information
- Non-compliance with policies or procedures

Developed bottom-up

- YOU make the policies
- The RIPE NCC implements them
