Recently Concluded

- 2008-05, Anycasting Assignments for TLDs and Tier 0/1 ENUM
 - Reached consensus in June 2009
- 2009-02, Allocating/Assigning Resources to the RIPE NCC
 - Reached consensus in July 2009



Ongoing Discussions – IPv4 Depletion

- How should the last /8 be used?
 - 2008-06, Use of final /8
 - Every LIR gets minimum allocation
 - A /16 is reserved for unforeseen circumstances
 - 2009-04, IPv4 Allocation and Assignments to Facilitate IPv6 Deployment
 - Minimum allocation and assignment size = /27
 - Only IPv6 deployers receives space from the last /8
 - Competing proposals



Ongoing Discussions – IPv4 Depletion

- 2009-03, Run out Fairly
 - Gradually reduce the allocation and assignment periods
 - Follows expected life time of the IPv4 unallocated pool
 - Avoiding a very large address space user to receive a huge allocation that pre-empts a lot of requests from smaller users



ASN 32

- 2009-07, IANA Policy for Allocation of ASNs to RIRs
 - ASN 32 uptake is slower than expected
 - IANA still has 16 bit ASNs but will “cease making distinction” between pools by January 2010
 - Potential risk for RIRs not to qualify for ASN16 bits after January 2010 under current policy
 - Inducing LIRs not to receive 16 bit ASNs
 - **Global** Proposal to shift the date to “cease making distinction” between pools to January 2011

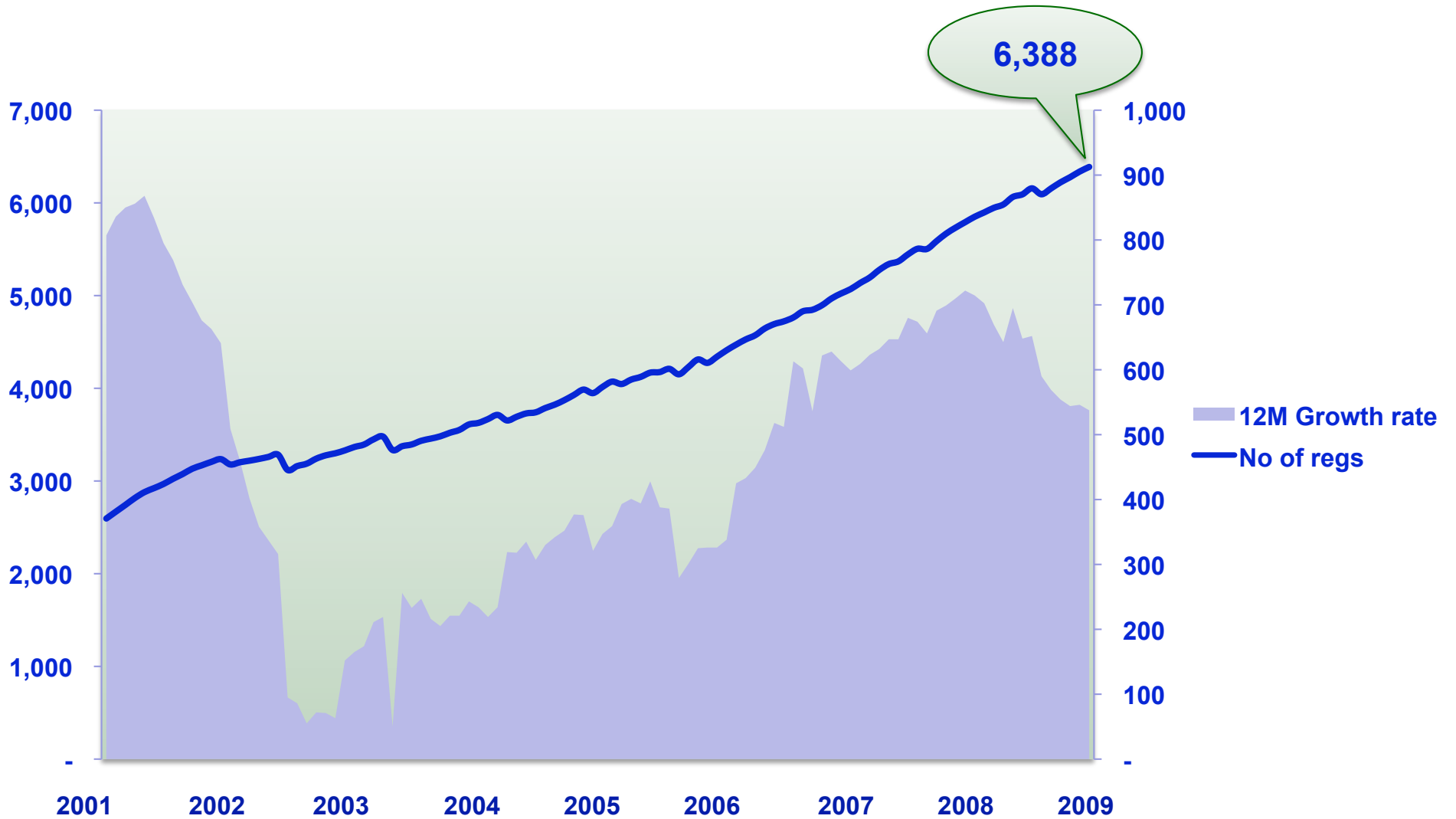

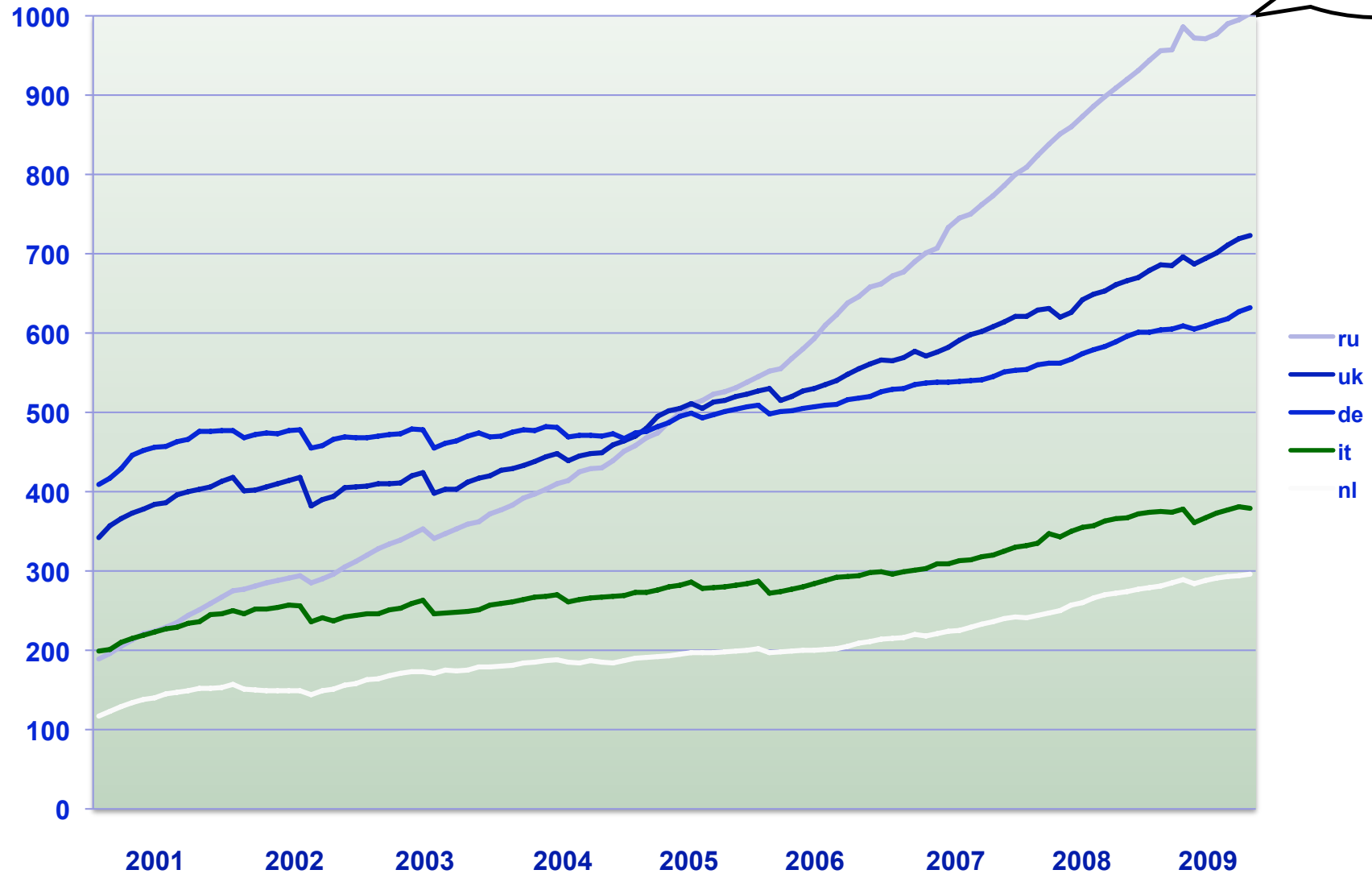


Membership development 2001 – Sept 2009





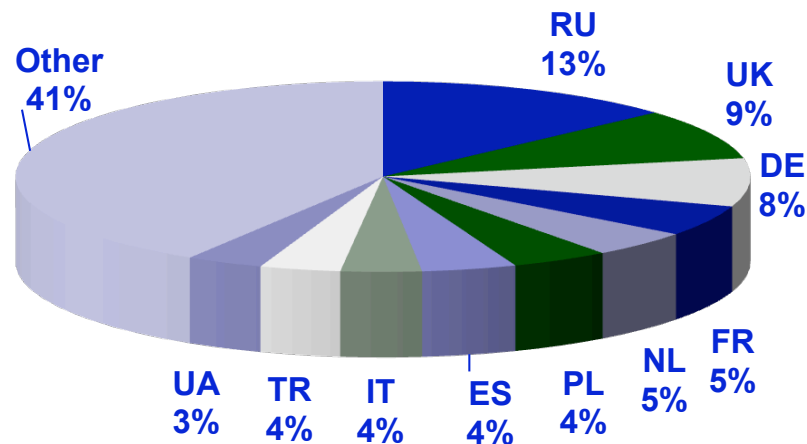
Top 5 countries 2001 – Aug 2009



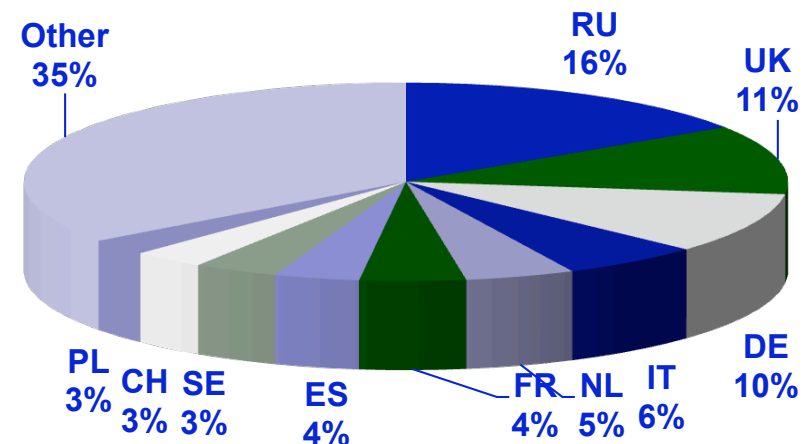
Russian member info September 2009

New members per country 2009

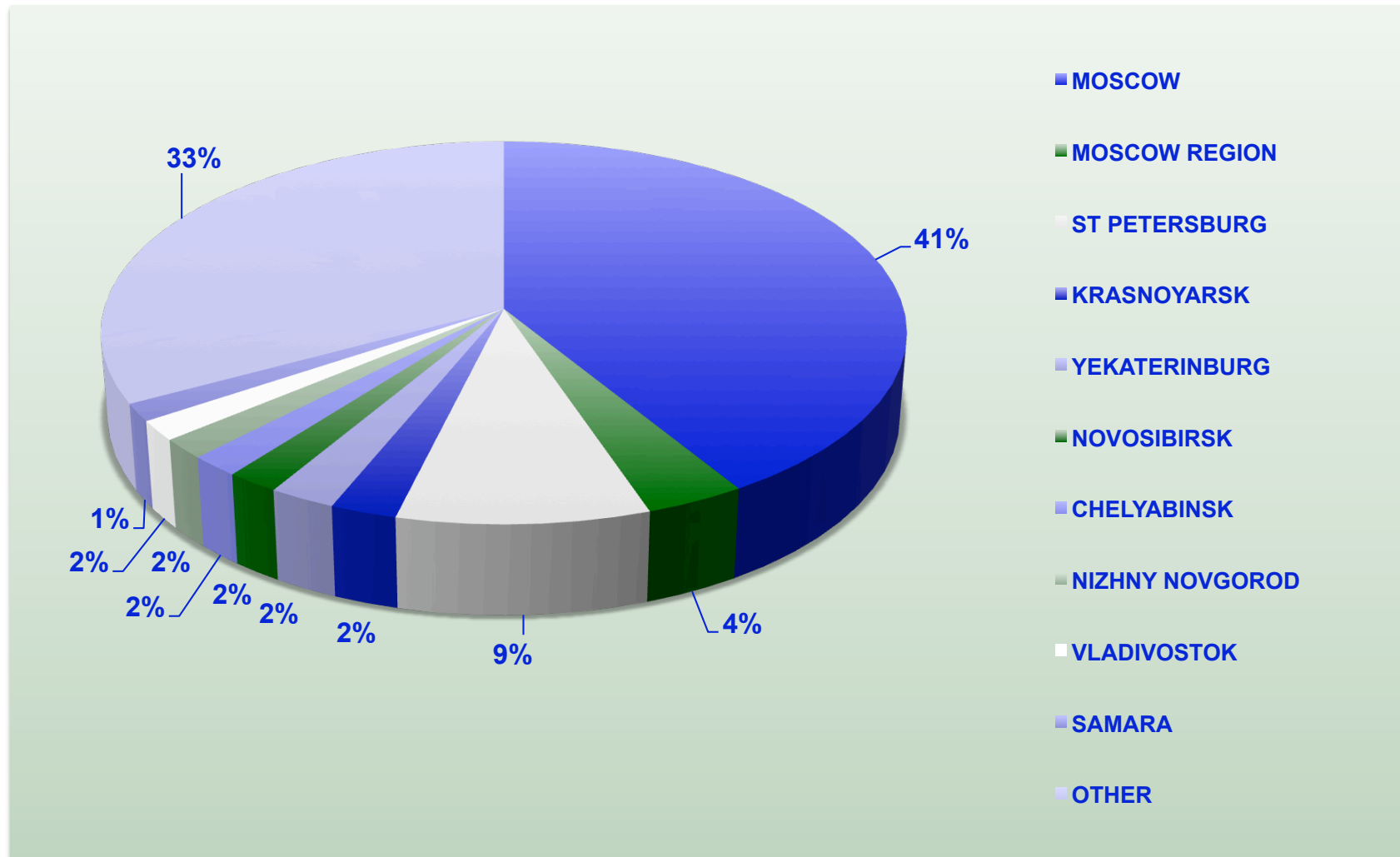


Members per country 2009





Russian member info per city 2009





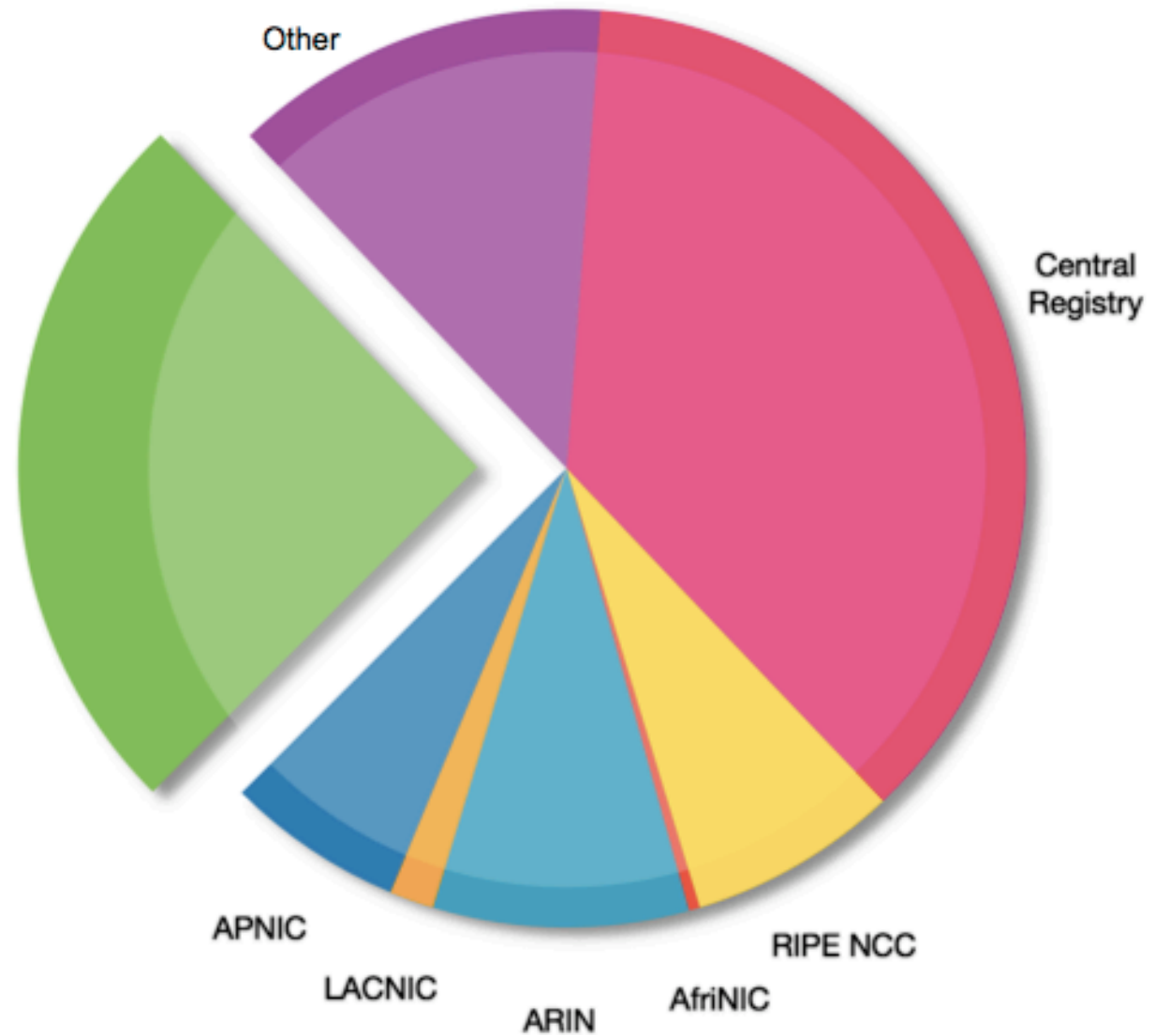

IPv4 Address Pool - June 2005

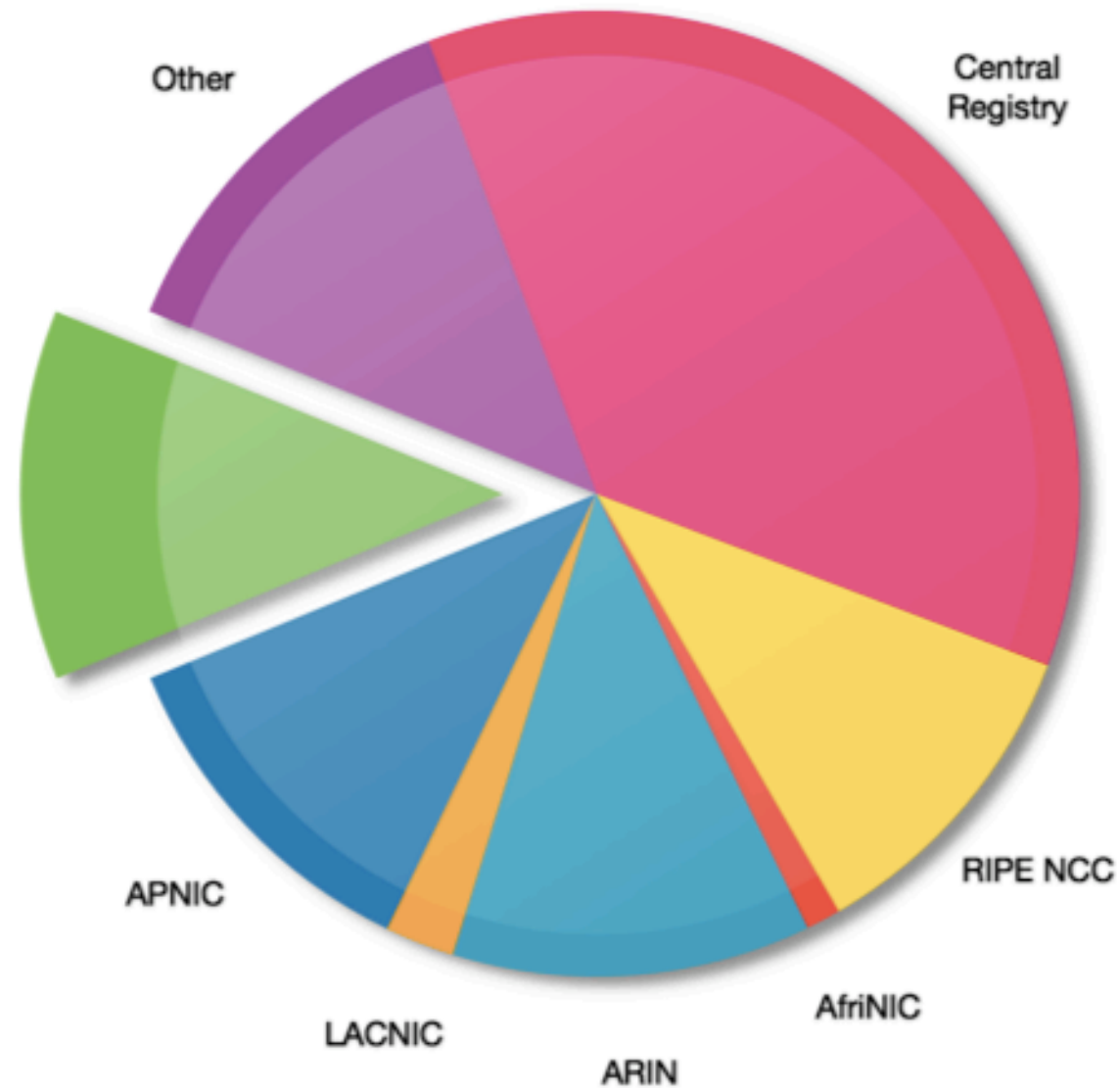

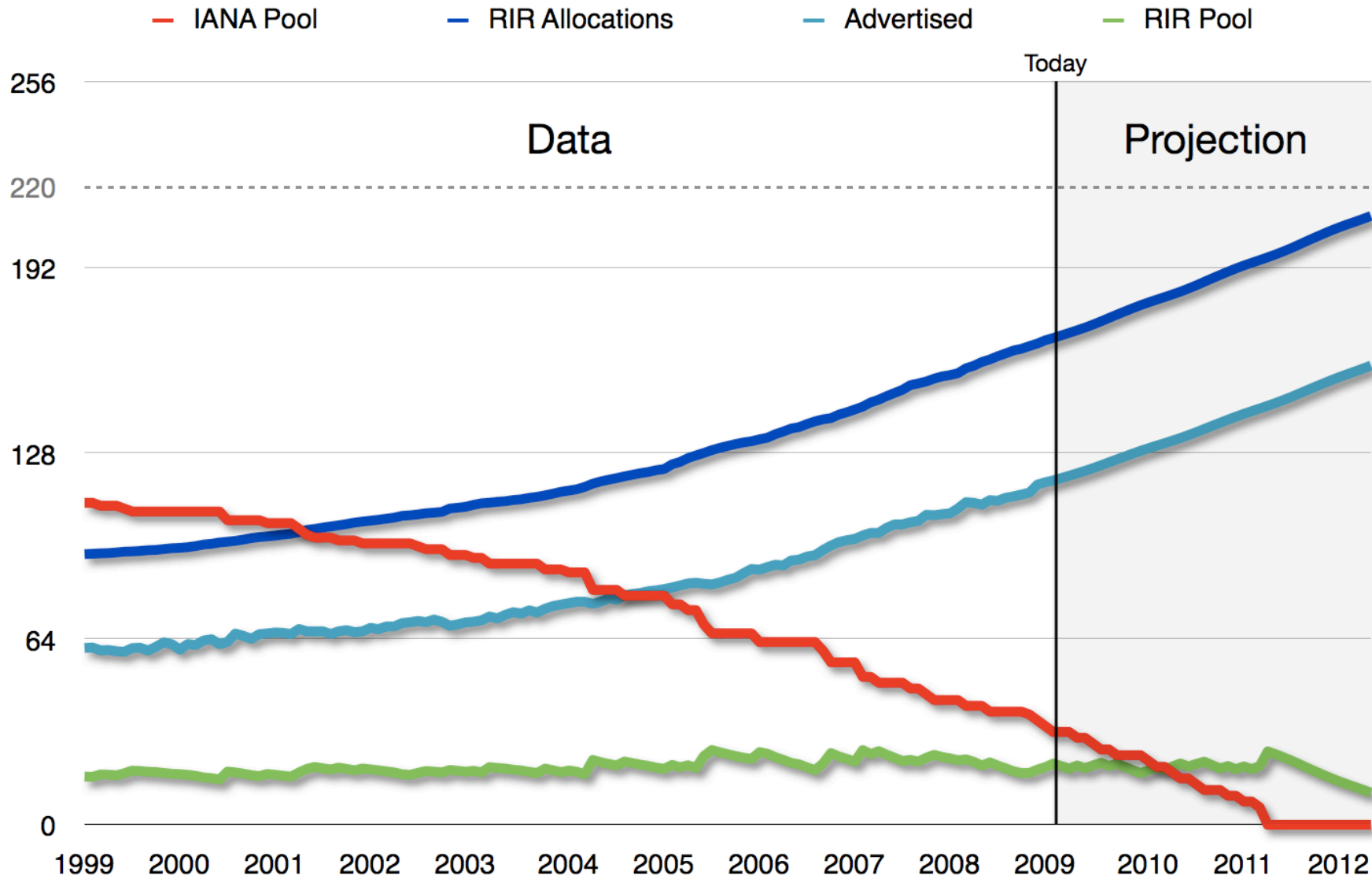
IPv4 Address Pool - Now

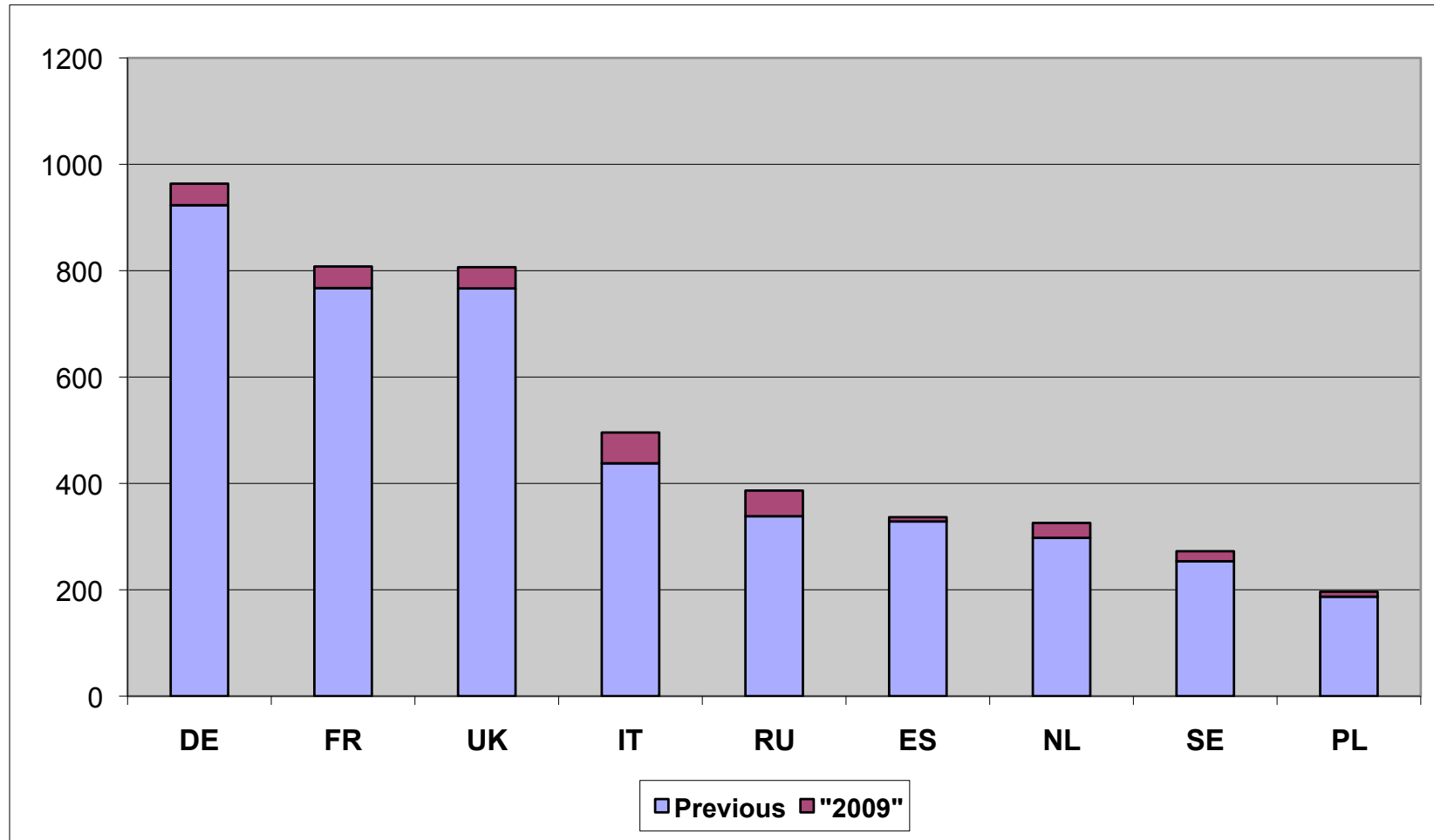

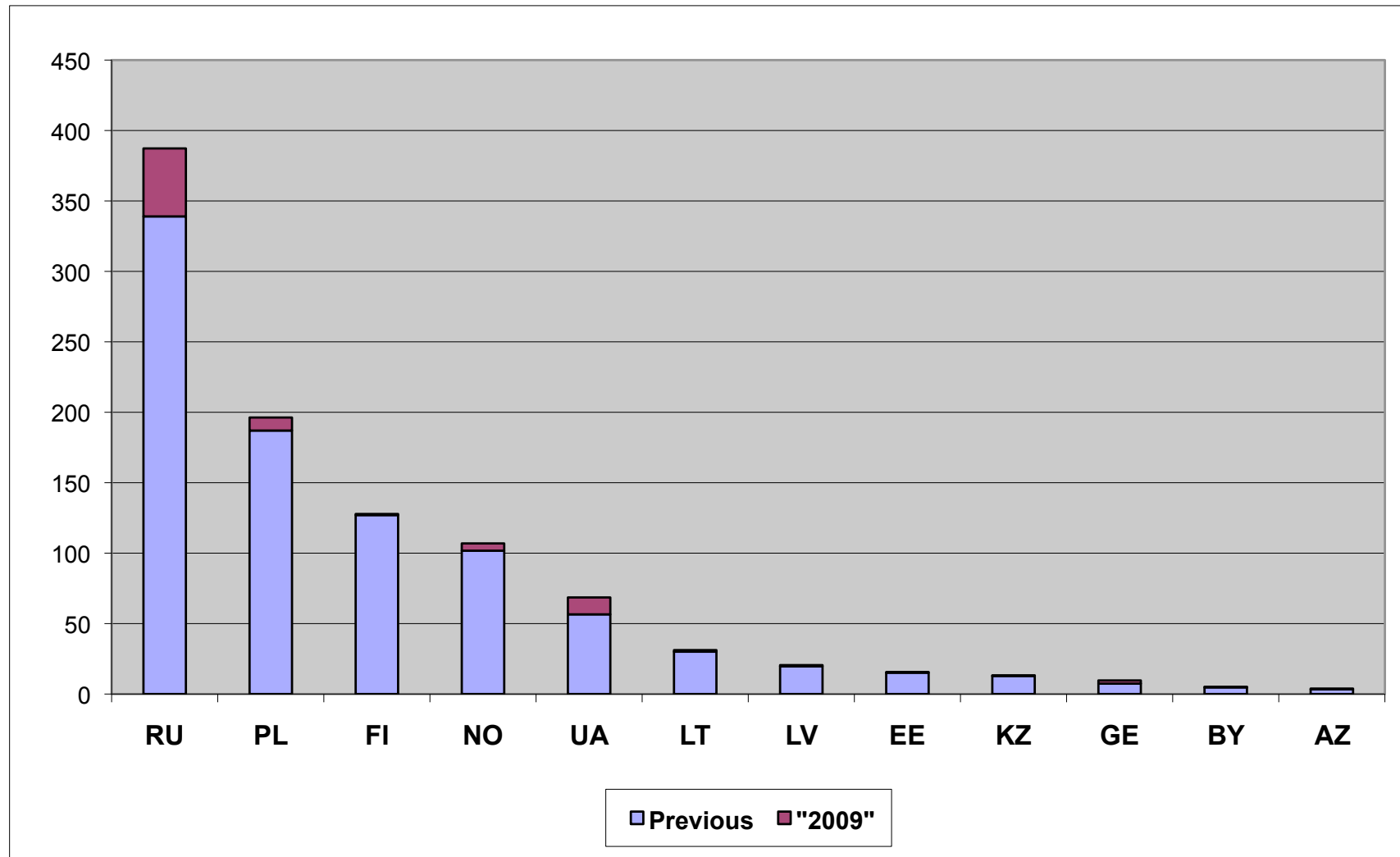


IPv4 Address space per country



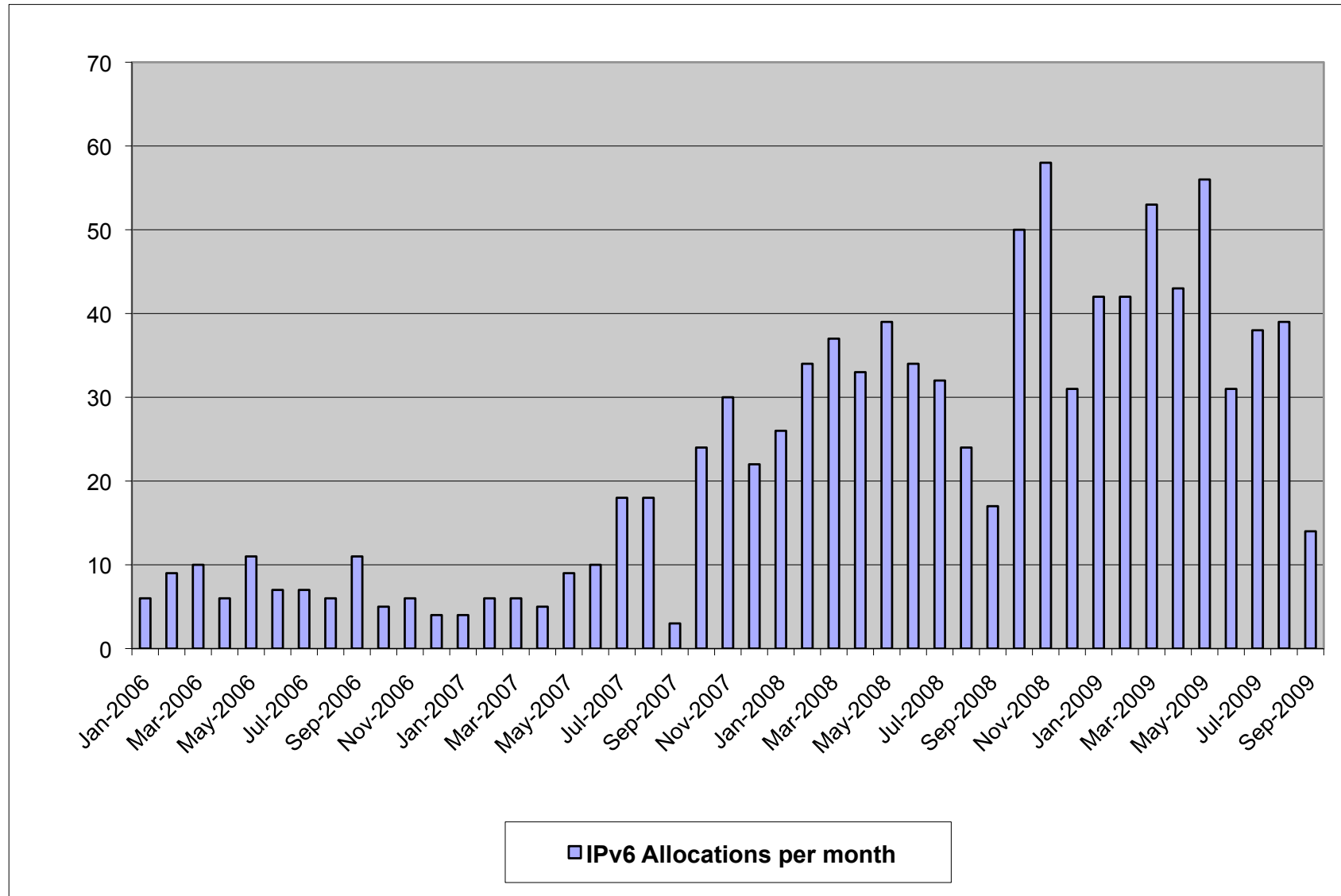

IPv6 Prefixes visible in BGP

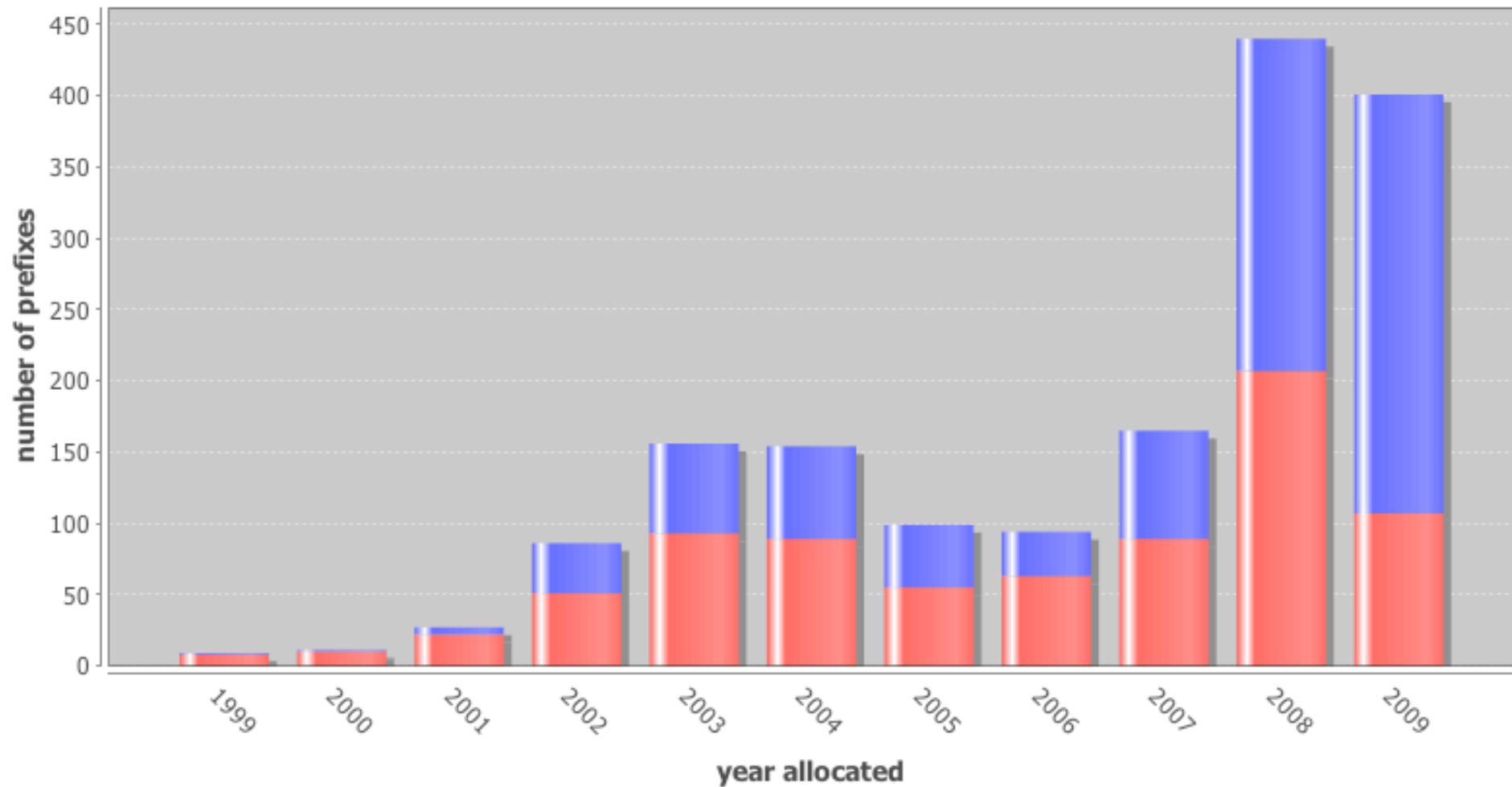
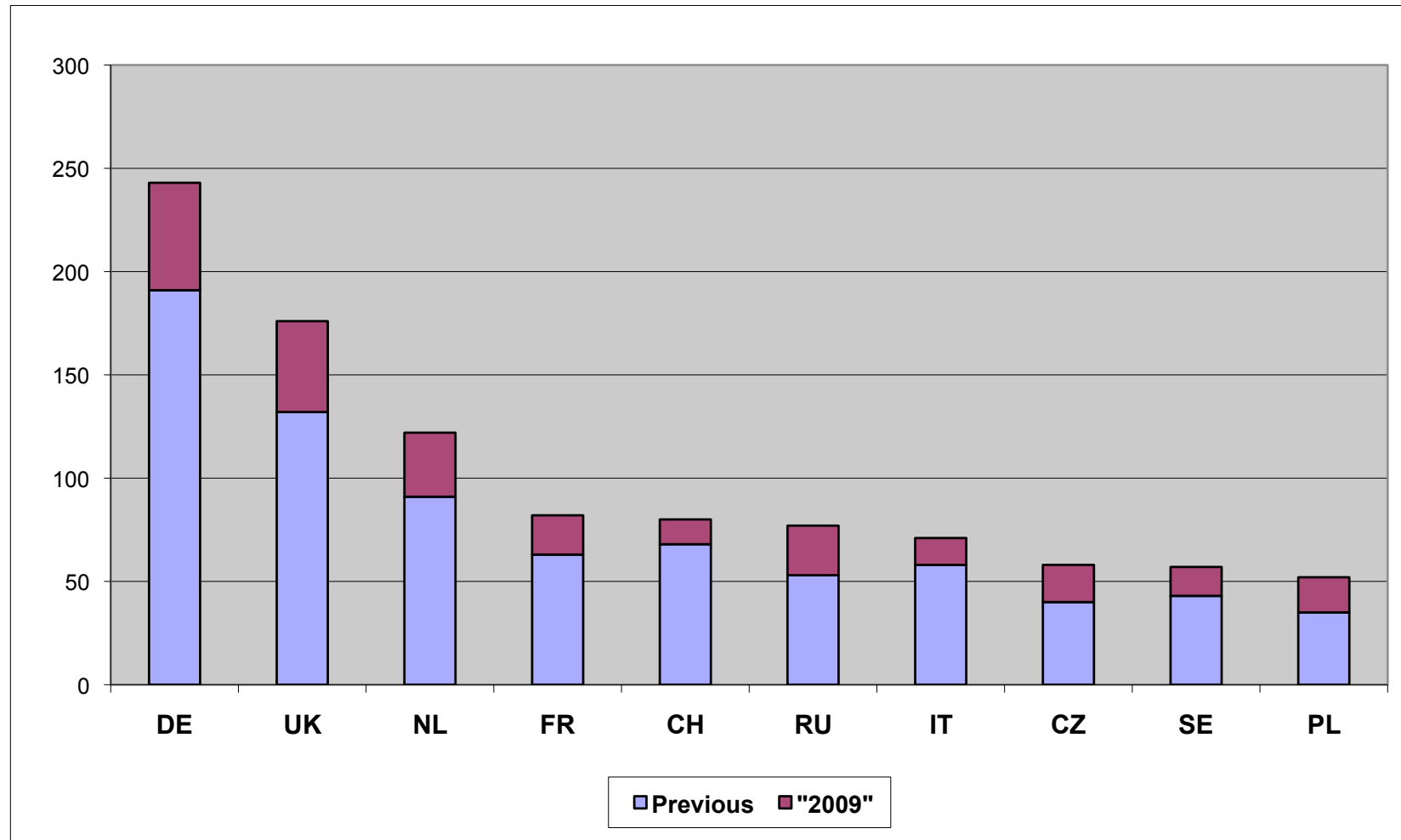

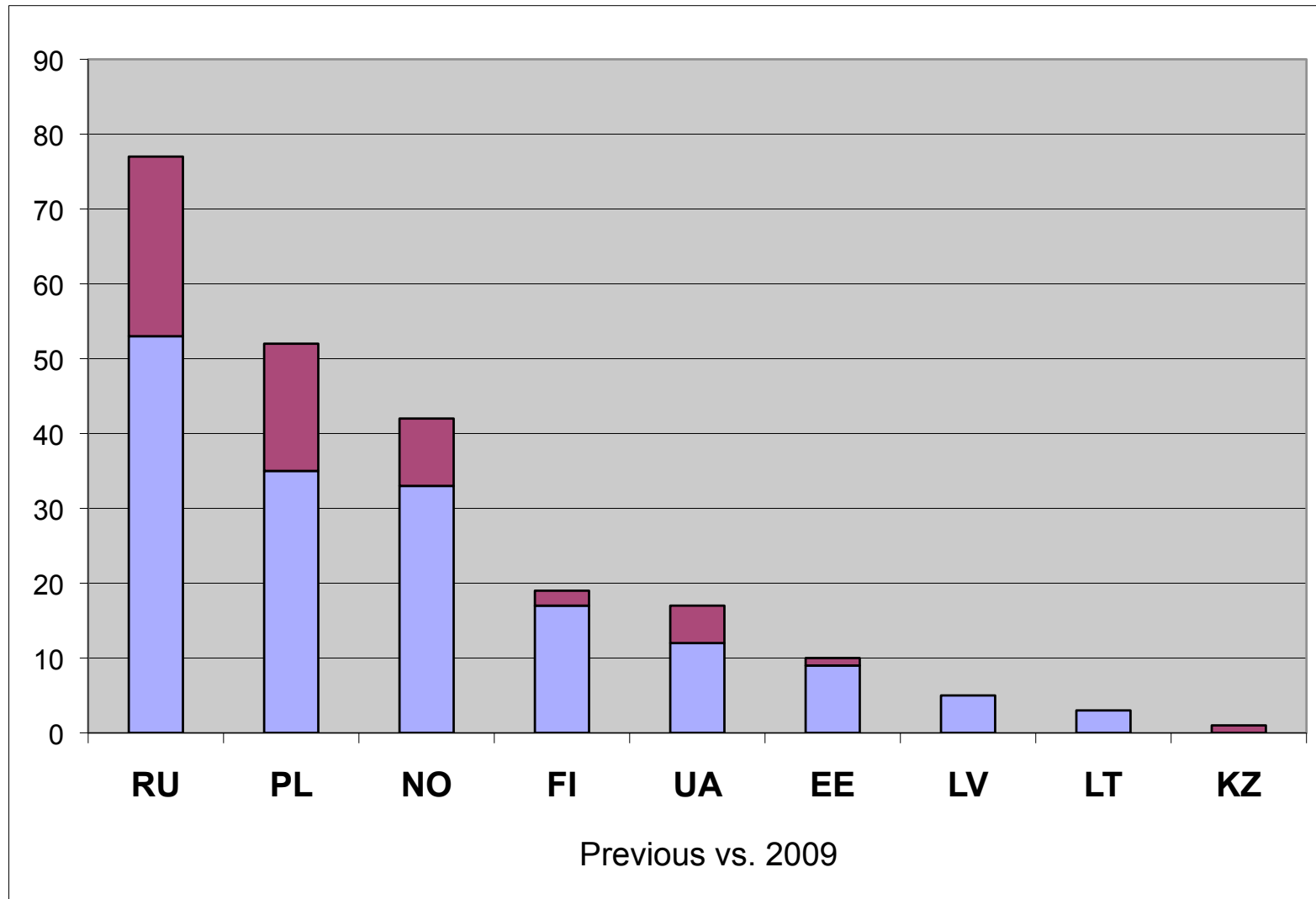

Number of allocations shown

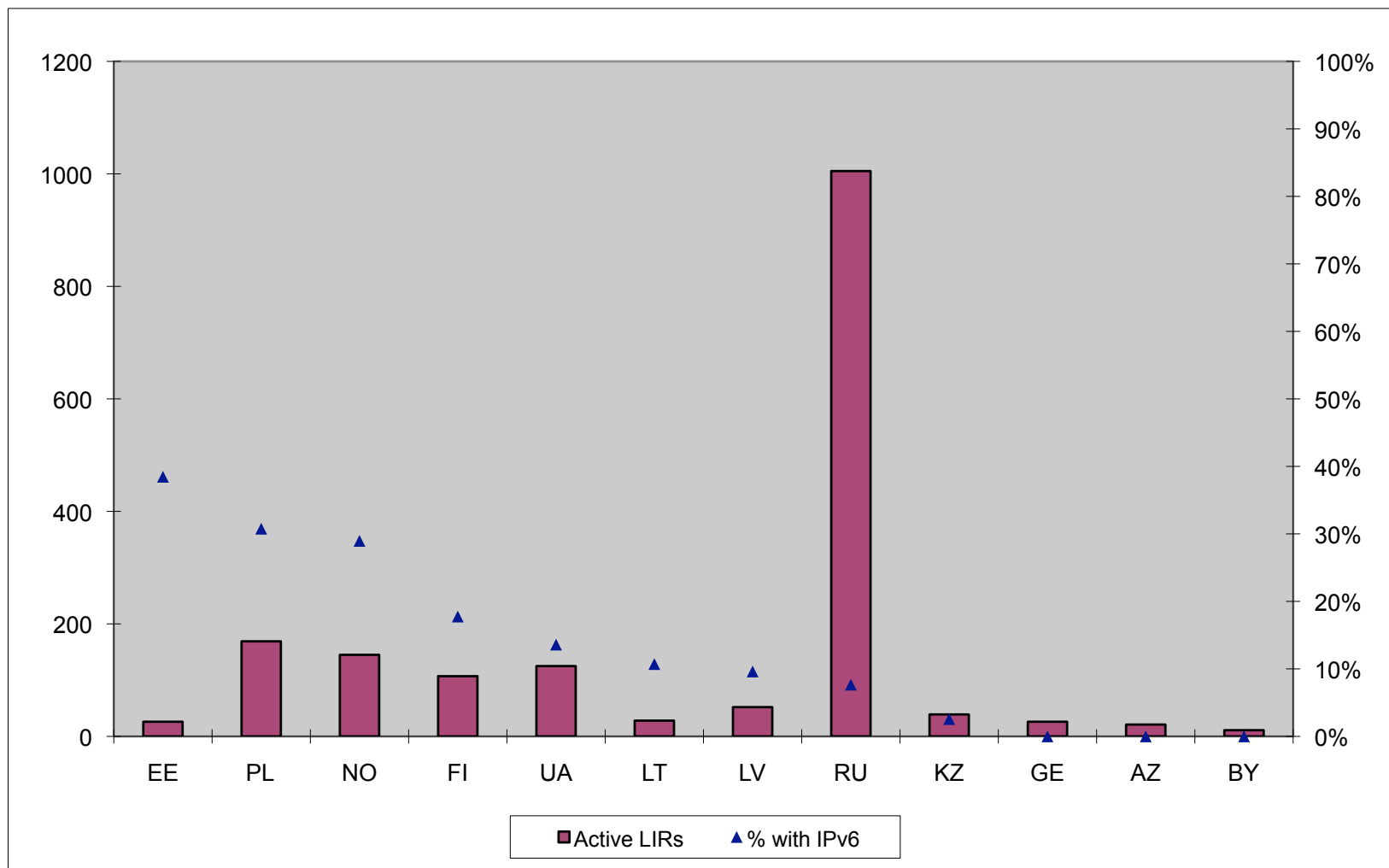
IPv6 – Regional Statistics
