


Outcomes of the Dubai Government Roundtable and the RIPE NCC update

Responsibilities




- Distribute IP addresses and AS Numbers

Challenges and Actions

National Resources and Billing



- What we heard
 - Greater collaboration
 - Helping preserve national resources
 - Flexibility with payments

- √ Close collaboration with regulators through focal points
- √ Extension of payment deadline

Capacity Building



- What we heard
 - A need for more capacity building
 - Sharing best practices

- ✓ Dedicated trainings and webinars were delivered covering Saudi Arabia, Iraq, United Arab Emirates, Lebanon, Jordan, and Oman
- ✓ Online meetings and support for Kuwait, Yemen, Qatar, Bahrain, Syria and Palestine
- √ Academic webinars for undergraduates

Internet Measurements and Statistics



- What we heard
 - Data, statistics and reports at country and regional level are valuable for policy makers and operators

- √ The RIPE NCC published a second Country Report on GCC Countries
- 'Measurements and Tools' webinars with regulatory authorities and operators
- √ RIPE Atlas software probes launched and hardware probe version 5 under development

Language Support



- What we heard
 - More documents and support in Arabic required

- √ A new language policy in development to support Arabic and other languages
- √ The RIPE NCC Gulf Country Report is available in Arabic
- √ A few documents have already been translated in Arabic covering topics like how to become a member, policies, resources and transfers
