

Supporting Notes for the RIPE NCC Autonomous System Number Request Form

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Abstract

This document provides supporting notes to the Autonomous System Number Request Form. It contains instructions on how to complete the request form for AS Numbers, in the RIPE document: "RIPE NCC Autonomous System Number Request Form" at:

Instructions

Please read all the information below carefully before submitting your application for an AS Number. For more detailed explanations on routing policy objects, please refer to "Routing Policy Specification Language (RPSL)" (RFC 2622). For an explanation on when an AS Number is needed, please see: "Guidelines for Creation, Selection and Registration of an Autonomous System" (RFC 1930). For Autonomous System Number policies, please refer to the RIPE document: "European Internet Registry Policies and Procedures" at:

When sending the completed AS Number request form to the RIPE NCC, all information requested in the form must be supplied, including the technical routing policy. In some

cases, the RIPE NCC will request additional information.

Administrative and Technical Information

Current assignment guidelines only allow the RIPE NCC to assign AS Numbers to multihomed organisations that need to define their own unique routing policy. To evaluate the request in this regard, the enterprise will have to provide information on who they will be peering with by specifying a routing policy in the "import:" and "export:" attributes. The enterprise will also have to provide information about which IP addresses they will be routing (originating) with this AS.

The "aut-num:" attributes described below are a minimal set sufficient to register most common situations. Please consult RFC 2622 for full details on the syntax of these and other attributes.

Note: All Database objects (such as **mntner**, **as-set** or **router-set** objects) referenced in the aut-num template should be entered into the Database before submitting the request or included on the request form.

Aut-num Template Fields

aut-num:      <as number>  
              Specifies the temporary name of the AS to  
              be assigned. This name is usually needed  
              for the "export:" expression below. It  
              is suggested to use NEW. In case multiple  
              AS-es are required, NEW1, NEW2, etc can  
              be used. This field will be replaced with  
              the AS Number that will be assigned to  
              the organisation. This field is mandatory;  
              only a single line is possible.  
  
as-name:      <object-name>  
              The "as-name:" attribute is a descriptive  
              name (in RPSL name syntax) associated with  
              the AS. It is recommended to use an as-name  
              that relates to the organisation for which  
              the AS number is being requested. The  
              as-name should be written as a SINGLE word  
              of alphanumeric characters or a hyphen  
              ('-') or underscore ('_') ONLY. It cannot  
              start with the prefix "AS". Please refer to  
              RFC 2622 for more information.

              This field is mandatory; only a single

descr:        <free-form>  
              A short description of the Autonomous  
              System, including the organisation using

the AS Number and its location, to provide sufficient detail to distinguish your organisation from others in the RIPE Database. The full postal address is not needed as this is provided in the person template (see below). This field is mandatory; multiple lines are possible.

member-of: list of <set-name>
The value of the "member-of:" attribute identifies an as-set object that this object wants to be a member of. This claim, however, should be acknowledged by a respective "mbrs-by-ref:" attribute in the referenced object. Please refer to RFC 2622 for more information. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

import: [protocol <protocol-1>] [into <protocol-2>]
Specifies import policy expression.
Syntax: from <peering-1> [action <action-1>]
. . .
from <peering-N> [action <action-N>]
accept <filter>
Example:
aut-num: AS1
import: from AS2 accept { 128.9.0.0/16 }
The action specification is optional.
The semantics of an "import:" attribute is as follows: the set of routes that are matched by <filter> are imported from all the peers in <peerings>; while importing routes at <peering-M>, <action-M> is executed. Please refer to RFC 2622 for more information. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

export: to <peering-1> [action <action-1>]
Specifies an export policy expression.
Syntax:
export: to <peering-1> [action <action-1>]
. . .
to <peering-N> [action <action-N>]
announce <filter>
The action specification is optional.
The semantics of an export attribute is as follows: the set of routes that are matched by <filter> are exported to all the peers specified in <peerings>; while exporting routes at <peering-M>, <action-M> is executed.
Example:
aut-num: AS1
export: to AS2 announce AS4
Please refer to RFC 2622 for more information. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

default: to <peering> [action <action>]
[networks <filter>]

Description of default routes. If a peer will be used as a default for this network, an indication of how default routing will be done should be provided here.

Syntax:

```
default: to <peering> [action <action>]
[networks <filter>]
```

The <action> and <filter> specifications are optional. The semantics are as follows: The <peering> specification indicates the AS (and the router if present) it is being defaulted to; the <action> specification, if present, indicates various attributes of defaulting, for example a relative preference if multiple defaults are specified; and the <filter> specifications, if present, is a policy filter. A router only uses the default policy if it received the routes matched by <filter> from this peer. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

remarks: <free-form>

Remarks or comments, to be used for clarification. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

admin-c:

The NIC handle referenced in the person object (see below), which represents the administrative contact for the Autonomous System. It is recommended that the administrative contact is physically located at the site that will be using the AS Number. More than one contact can be specified by adding more "admin-c:" fields. This field is mandatory; multiple lines are possible.

tech-c:

The NIC handle referenced in the person object (see below), which represents the technical contact for the Autonomous System. There can be more than one name specified in multiple fields for this template. This field is mandatory; multiple lines are possible.

cross-mnt:

list of <mntner-name>
Contains a list of mntner(s) to be notified for overlaps with any of the prefixes announced in route objects in which the given AS number is specified in the "origin:" attribute. A notification will be sent to mailbox(es) listed in cross-nfy and mailbox(es) listed in the "mnt-nfy:" attributes of the maintainers referenced by the cross-mnt whenever an overlapping route is added or removed. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

cross-nfy:

<nic-handle>
The "cross-nfy:" attribute contains a NIC-handle pointing to a person or role object.

The email address of this person or role object will be used for notification for overlaps with any of the prefixes announced in route objects in which the given AS number is specified in the "origin:" attribute. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.

- notify:** <e-mail>
Specifies the e-mail address to which notifications of changes to the aut-num object will be sent.
This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.
- mnt-lower:** list of <mntner-name>
Specifies the identifier of a registered mntner object used for hierarchical authorisation. Protects creation of objects directly (one level) below in the hierarchy of the aut-num object. The authentication method of this maintainer object will then be used upon creation of any object directly below this aut-num object. This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.
- mnt-routes:** <mnt-name>
[{ list of <address-prefix-range> } | ANY]
This attribute references a maintainer object which is used in determining authorisation for the creation of route objects. After the reference to the maintainer, an optional list of prefix ranges inside of curly braces or the keyword "ANY" may follow. The default, when no additional set items are specified, is "ANY" or all more specifics. Please refer to RFC 2622 for more information.
This field is optional; multiple lines are possible.
- mnt-by:** list of <mntner-name>
Specifies the identifier of a registered mntner object used for authorisation of operations performed with the object that contains this attribute. This field is mandatory; multiple lines are possible.
- changed:** <e-mail> [<date>]
Specifies who submitted the update, and when the object was updated. The format of the date is YYYYMMDD; dates in the future are not allowed. If the date is not specified, the database will put the date when the update was actually processed. This field is mandatory; multiple lines are possible.
- source:** <registry-name>
Specifies the registry where the object is registered. Should be "RIPE" for the RIPE Database. This field is mandatory; only a single line is possible.

Maintainer Information

It is required for each **aut-num** (autonomous number) object to reference a **mntner** (maintainer) object. If the maintainer information is already in the RIPE Database, then the person handling the request should check to see if it is up to date. If there is no database entry, one should now be created by using the following template. An example is included below.

Contact Information

Each **aut-num** and **mntner** object references contact persons, which also need to be entered in the RIPE Database. If the contact information is already in the RIPE Database, then the person handling the request should check to see if it is up to date. If there is no database entry, one should now be created by using the following template. An example is included below.

****NOTE:** Each person or role object in the RIPE Database should contain a NIC handle which allows unambiguous identification of the appropriate persons as needed for Internet network administration. A RIPE NIC handle has the form "MK16-RIPE". To obtain a NIC handle, just put

nic-hdl: AUTO-1

OR

nic-hdl: AUTO-1YourInitials

in the "nic-hdl:" field of the object to be added to the database. If "YourInitials" are specified (no less than 2, and no more than 4 letters), the database will use them in constructing a NIC handle. Otherwise, it will determine the letters itself. In both cases, the NIC handle is guaranteed to be unique.

You can reference these (AUTO-1 or AUTO-1YourInitials) as temporary NIC handles in the same update message in the fields of other objects that require a NIC handle (e.g. the **inetnum** object described above). The database software will then fill in the freshly assigned NIC handles in the objects. Note that you can also use other numbers (example: AUTO-2) so that you can add more objects in one e-mail message.
